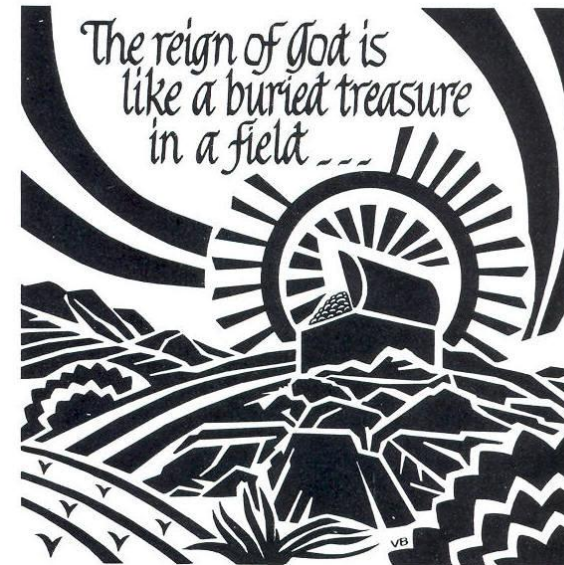

MASS AND SCHEDULE UPDATES:

Beginning the first weekend of August, we will be going back to our previous Mass schedule; Saturday Mass at 5:00pm and Sunday Masses at 8:15am and 10:30am.

This past month we have asked those attending weekday Masses to clean their area with provided antiseptic wipes before they leave church and it has worked very well.

Because of the residual odor of our present cleaning method of foggers, we are asking those who attend the 8:15am Mass on Sunday to clean their area before they leave. This way we will not have to worry about the fogger odor for those coming to the 10:30am Mass.

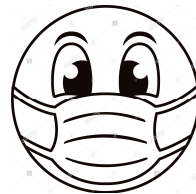
Large white buckets with cleaning material are available. If there is someone having difficulty cleaning their area, please lend a helping hand.

With the addition of this second Mass on Sunday, we will not be offering communion at the front door beginning in August.

Along with the return to our regular Mass schedule, the Facebook Live Streaming of our weekend Masses will continue but change. We will only be Live Streaming the Sunday 8:15am Mass or on special occasions, the 10:30am Mass.

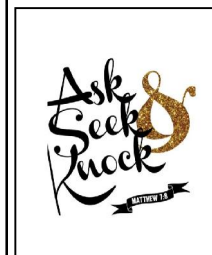
DAILY PRAYERS FOR VOCATIONS

FREE LUNCH FOR KIDS

Did you know that the Geneseo Lunch Box Summer Food Program is providing a FREE Lunch for Young People Ages 5-18 Every Weekday 11:00 to 12:30 at the Geneseo Community Center?

Q: Who is eligible for this free lunch?

A: ANY child or young person, ages 5-18. Children 5-9 must be accompanied by an adult or someone older than 14.

Q: What are the income qualifications for this free lunch?

A: There are no restrictions or income qualifications. All children may receive a meal each day

Q: Is there any paperwork requirement?

A: There is no paperwork involved.

Q: What kinds of foods are served?

A: Nutritious cold lunches are provided such as sub sandwiches, pizza, peanut butter sandwiches, grapes, carrot sticks, salads, milk & chocolate milk.

Q: What foods will be provided for those with dietary restrictions?

A: With one day's notice, gluten free, peanut-free and other lunches to meet dietary restrictions can be provided.

Q: Who is providing this lunch program?

A: The Geneseo Lunch Box Summer Food Program is a community-supported effort led by Brent Boxel, Executive Director of Geneseo First Methodist Church of Geneseo.

This program is possible through the generosity of local churches, business, foundations, and organizations with additional support from Illinois State Board of Education Nutrition Division and the USDA.

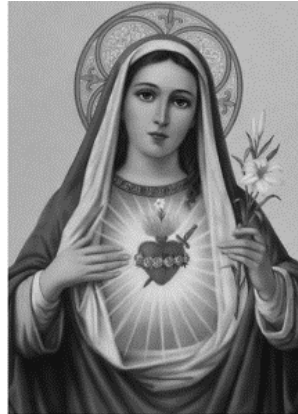

The month of August is dedicated to **The Immaculate Heart of Mary**. The entire month falls within the liturgical season of Ordinary Time, which is represented by the liturgical color green. This symbol of hope is the color of the sprouting seed and arouses in the faithful the hope of reaping the eternal harvest of heaven, especially the hope of a glorious resurrection. It is used in the offices and Masses of Ordinary Time.

It is the time of the year we begin to wind-down from our summer travels and vacations and prepare for Autumn - back to school, fall festivals, harvest time, etc. The Church in her holy wisdom has provided a cycle of events in its liturgical year which allow the faithful to celebrate the major feasts in the life of Christ and Mary. Most notably, during August, we celebrate the feast of the **Transfiguration** (August 6) and the feast of the **Assumption** (August 15).
