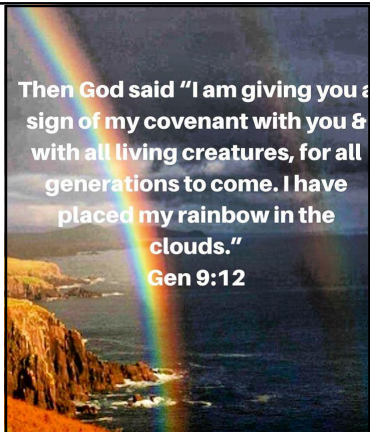

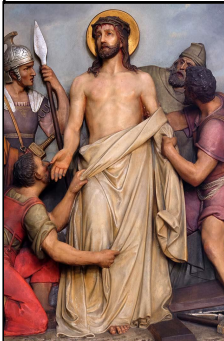

The Stations of the Cross are a 14-step Catholic devotion that commemorates Jesus Christ's last day on Earth as a man. The 14 devotions, or stations, focus on specific events of His last day, beginning with His condemnation. The stations are commonly used as a mini pilgrimage as the individual moves from station to station. At each station, the individual recalls and meditates on a specific event from Christ's last day. Specific prayers are recited, then the individual moves to the next station until all 14 are complete. Stations of the Cross are prayed on Fridays during Lent 12:00 noon and 7:00 pm.

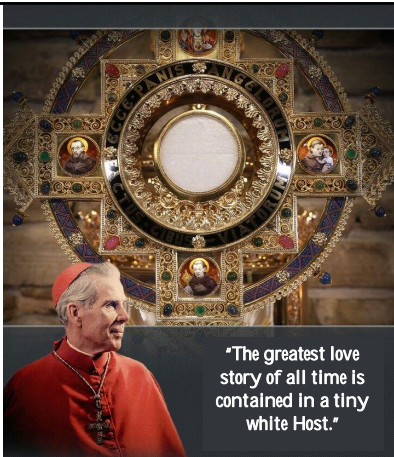

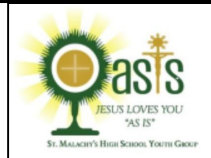

Dear St. Malachy Parishioners,

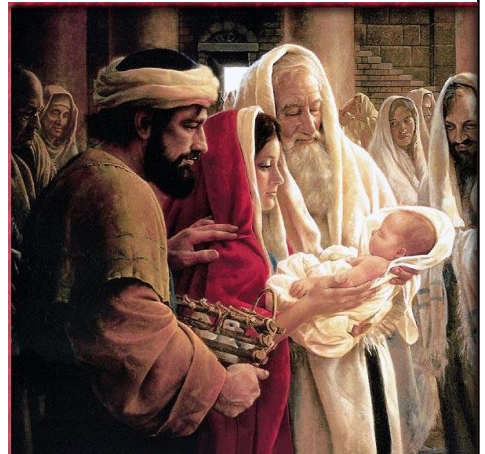
"The child's father and mother were amazed at what was said about Him..." (Luke 2:33). St. Joseph, Lover of Poverty, pray for us. Last weekend, I had the privilege of hearing the First Confessions of our parish children. As I discussed last weekend, it is always such a profound experience to encounter the faith of children. On one hand, it makes one want to offer what we have learned through the years, in order to guide them as they continue to grow in their faith. On the other hand, coming face to face with the natural goodness of their hearts can sometimes have the effect of making us grownups feel like the novices, when it comes to living as a child of God. Thus, when it comes to times of growth in one's faith, such as Lent (which begins this coming Wednesday), we need to remember that it is as much about being restored as it is about growth in maturity. It is far too easy to clutter and complicate our lives with things that crowd out and even seek to suffocate that pure and innocent identity as a child of God, not to mention how we can damage this relationship with the Lord at the core of being, by our sin. Lent is an opportunity to join Him in the desert, where there is nowhere to hide. To hunger and thirst with Him. To be alone with Him. To rediscover who we are. All three of the basic Lenten disciplines - Prayer, Fasting, and Almsgiving - help us to enter this desert experience in a meaningful way that truly becomes time spent drawing nearer to the Lord and becoming who we are. In the final days before this holy season, may Good Saint Joseph, Lover of Poverty, guide us all in discerning what form of each of these three disciplines we are being called to take up this year, so that we may courageously respond to this invitation. This way, our Lenten desert experience with the Lord can be a time of true restoration, in which we rediscover what it means to be a child of God.

LENTEN RECONCILIATION: If we are to be restored to our identity as a child of God, this cannot be done completely without the Sacrament that Christ gave us to restore us to the grace of our Baptism! Thus, as we did with Advent, I would like to begin a custom of increasing the opportunities to celebrate the Sacrament of Reconciliation during the Lenten Season. Yet again, a special Noon time for Confessions will be added on Monday-Thursday of each week during Lent, beginning on Ash Wednesday and continuing through Holy Week. I am also planning to select one of the weekends during March, when we can offer the sacrament after each of the weekend Masses. Stay tuned.

ASH WEDNESDAY: As I mentioned last weekend, the distribution of ashes will look a little different this year, due to the pandemic. Instead of being pressed into a cross on the forehead, ashes will be sprinkled over the top of the head. Also, the exhortation will be spoken once for the whole congregation, rather than individually. Please also be aware that the live-stream Mass option for that day will be the School Mass, **which has been moved to 9:15**, to allow more time after the 8 AM Mass.

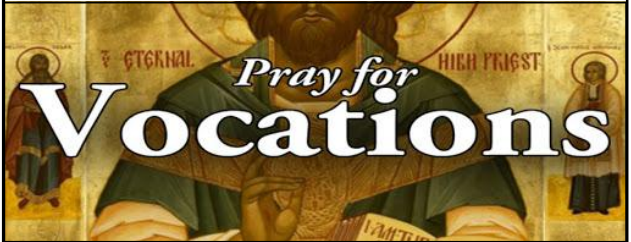
