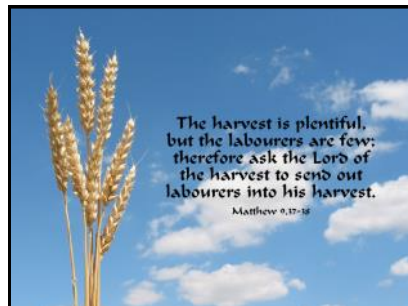

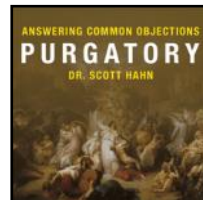

A Note From the Pastor

Dear St. Malachy Parishioners,

"Joseph, son of David, do not be afraid to take Mary your wife into your home. For it is through the holy Spirit that this child has been conceived in her..." (Matthew 1:20(b)). Saint Joseph, Most Courageous, Spouse of the Mother of God, pray for us! We thank God for the model Saint Joseph sets of courageous and humble obedience to the Lord, allowing his own fear to give way to a deeply rooted confidence in the Holy Spirit. Hoping to imitate this example, we conclude this October series of bulletin reflections on how the phrases we learned as children teach us how to pray with the faith of a child, by considering that simple word by which we learned to listen and obey, with a positive attitude: **Yes**. We have already discussed "I love You too," "Thank you," "I'm Sorry," and "Please."


One of the harder lessons we learn as children is that lesson to "listen and obey." In fact, we may more fondly remember when we learned the word "No," as we learned to assert our own individual choice. But, the obedience we must learn as children is meant to help us learn to use our free will well and make good choices. In fact, our "yes," to that which we ought to do, needs the support of a firm, clear and well-informed "no" to that which ought not be done or allowed. So, we do indeed want to teach children - and also ourselves - when, where and how to say, "no." Our "yes" to the right things, will only be as good as our ability to say "no" to the wrong things. Thus, we must listen to the Lord's direction, both in prayer and in study, so that we know what He's asking us to do. Then, we simply must be ready to say "yes." This may be a personal mission or a universal commandment, perhaps to which we have not yet conformed our lives. It may come through Scripture, through a homily or other lesson, or even in our own personal prayer.

Every Mass concludes with an exhortation ("Go and announce the Gospel of the Lord," "Go in peace, glorifying the Lord by your life," or even the simpler "Go forth, the Mass is ended" still implies that the Mass has changed us). Do we take the words of this dismissal to heart? Or do we sometimes identify with the observation that is sometimes made in jest, that our "Thanks be to God," in response to "The Mass is ended," can mean "Thanks be to God, it's over." Rather, do we let the Mass move us to obedience? After hearing the Word of God and being nourished by the Sacrament of the Holy Eucharist, do we go forth changed, with humble hearts renewed in their confidence in the Lord's goodness and strength, ready to go do His Will? This means we must learn to live lives of listening, allowing Him to reveal His Will for us. We must be like children, anxiously anticipating, not only how I will have the opportunity to serve today, but how I will have the opportunity to learn and grow today. *May we continue to... Follow Jesus with the faith of a child!*

What Is This Synod Thing We Are Praying For?: For the past few weeks, we have had special intentions in our Mass for the Synod, for which Bishop Lou has asked us to pray. What's that all about? Essentially, a Synod is simply a gathering of bishops and other church leaders either worldwide or within a more localized group (in this case, worldwide) "to discuss the doctrinal and pastoral needs of the Church" (quoted from the Glossary of the Catechism of the Catholic Church). Commonly, each synod will identify a particular theme or topic. The theme this time around is *For a Synodal Church: Communion, Participation, Mission*. One may joke that it seems like it's a synod on synods. But, all joking aside, it really is quite a timely topic. When Bishop Lou addressed the priests directly at the conclusion of our Assembly Days last week, he told us that the synod is essentially "about who we are as a Church." In a world that is changing with evolving needs, it is good for us to remember, not only our place within this world, but also to recall where our structure and identity comes from: not from the world, but from

Christ. He is the constant and the core of our identity as the People of God. When we study His Gospel, we see that He began by regathering a scattered people, calling together people who would have trouble getting along and inviting them to see one another as brothers and sisters, as together He led them home to the Father by a path that led through the cross. Two thousand years later, we are still a broken, scattered and often hurting people in an equally broken, scattered and hurting world, still called together by Christ and looking to Him alone to find our strength, our identity, our unity, and even our healing. It is Jesus Christ who unites us, heals us, and shows us who we are. His Gospel and His Church have been entrusted to us and we must understand anew, in this unique moment in our history which has seen much division, what it means for us to both guard and hand on this precious treasure, which makes us one. The whole process of the synod will take a few years and “will be an opportunity for us to grow in our understanding of the centrality of the model of participative and shared co-responsibility in preaching the Gospel,” according to Bishop Lou. In his journeys to better know our diocese (the people and parishes, not just the roads!) Bishop Lou has modeled this process of listening and conversation, which the Synod is all about. As I recently mentioned, a few of our parishioners represented our parish at a gathering he hosted for our vicariate in Atkinson a few weeks ago, and he is anxious to share these insights with the synod. Let us pray for the guidance of the Holy Spirit, that graces of healing and renewal may overflow from this synod to the whole People of God, even to those of us here in Geneseo.

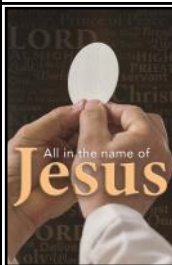

Liturgy Leanings for November 2021

November--Month of All Souls; The season of Ordinary Time and the Cycle of Year B readings concludes on November 21 with the feast of "Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe." The last Sunday of November, the 28th, begins a new liturgical year, the season of Advent, and the beginning of the Year C readings. Violet is the color of the season of Advent. "National Vocations Awareness Week." begins on Sunday, November 7.

The feast day of the patron saint of our parish, Saint Malachy O'More, is November 3. This year we will celebrate the patronal feast day as a parish on Sunday, November 7. Saint Malachy was born in 1095 at Armagh, Ireland and was ordained for the priesthood at the age of 25; he became a bishop five years later. He worked to re-establish and unify the Catholic faith in Ireland, and would seek out the people in their fields and their homes when they did not come to church. He was the Bishop of Armagh from 1129-1148 and was canonized in 1190 by Pope Clement III.

Saints whose memorials are observed during November:

11/1 - (Monday) All Saints' Day: A Holy Day: May we be inspired to imitate not only the lives of those who are canonized saints, but also those whom we have known who we believe are living forever in heaven with God; Masses at 8:00 a. m., 9:00 a. m. (school), and 5:45 p. m.

11/2 - All Souls' Day: A commemoration of all the Faithful Departed; we especially think of those who have died since last All Souls' Day; the dead are honored throughout the month of November.

11/13 - Saint Frances Xavier Cabrini: Italian immigrant to New York; became a naturalized citizen of the United States in 1909. After her death in Chicago, in 1917, reports of some 150,000 miracles flooded the Vatican; she was canonized in 1946 by Pope Pius XII, the first U.S. citizen to be canonized; National Shrine in Chicago; founded the Missionary Sisters of the Sacred Heart.

11/16 - Saint Margaret of Scotland: Queen of Scotland, mother of eight children, dedicated to prayer, good works, restoring monasteries.

11/17 - Saint Elizabeth of Hungary: Queen of Hungary, special care for poor, feeding the hungry, and nursing the sick; she cared so much for the poor that she gave up her own bed to a beggar. When her husband went to throw the beggar out, he discovered Christ himself.

11/18 - Saint Rose Philippine Duchesne: came to Missouri to educate Native Americans and the poor of St. Louis; a member of the Society of the Sacred Heart, she and the sisters established orphanages and schools across this country; canonized July 3, 1988 by Pope John Paul II; shrine in St. Charles, Mo.

11/22 - Saint Cecilia, third-century martyr who died because she would not forsake her vow of virginity or make sacrifices to the gods; the patron saint of musicians, singers and poets.

11/24 - Saint Andrew Dung-Lac and Companions: Vietnamese priest and 117 companions who died practicing the Catholic faith in Vietnam between the 16th and 17th centuries.

11/30 - Saint Andrew, Apostle- the first of the Twelve to meet and follow Jesus, then he brought his brother, Simon Peter, to Jesus.
