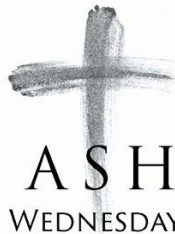

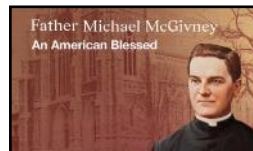

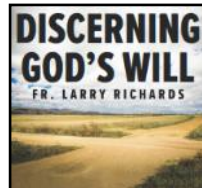

A Note From the Pastor

Dear St. Malachy Parishioners

Follow Jesus... with the Faith of a Child! It is with this child-like trust that we follow Jesus... into the desert. It is hard to believe that the desert season of Lent is already coming up this week! Last week, I mentioned the study *Into His Likeness*, which will be taking place throughout Lent, as a great way to draw near to Him. This week, I'd like to mention a few more things even more specific to those Lenten disciplines of Prayer, Fasting and Almsgiving.

- **Adoration:** All of our efforts to grow in faith and thus prepare well for Easter would bear no fruit if we did not strive to draw near to the Lord in our time in the desert. One great way to draw near to Him in prayer is through setting aside time for Eucharistic Adoration. This includes any time spent in the presence of Our Lord in the Tabernacle, but especially when He is exposed for prayer in the monstrance. This time of Adoration is offered twice every week: Mondays (3 PM - 8 PM) and Thursdays (4:30-5:30 PM). Additionally, we offer short times of Adoration after the 8 AM Mass on the First Friday and First Saturday of each month. I encourage you to stop in for any of these times of quiet prayer, whether you can stay for an hour or even only a few minutes.

Beginning this coming Monday (2/28), the Monday Adoration will again be offered in the parish chapel, rather than the main church. It is my hope that the intimate environment offered there might help many to draw near to the Lord in prayer.

- **Reconciliation:** Another important way in which we draw near to the Lord, which is especially relevant to Lent, is through the Sacrament of Reconciliation. The sacrament is offered four times a week, all year around: 8:45-9 AM (Mon, Tues); 5-5:30 PM (Thurs); 3:30-4:30 (Sat). Additional opportunities will be offered for Lent: Mon-Wed at Noon to 12:30 (which I


can already tell you will need to be canceled in the week of March 21-25) and at a special Holy Hour with Confessions at 6:30 PM on Tuesday, March 29th.

- **Stations of the Cross:** Our time with the Lord in the desert prepares us to draw near Him at the cross, during Holy Week, in order to enter into His Resurrection in the Easter Season. We remember this every Friday, when we turn our focus toward His cross. As was done last year, we will offer two weekly opportunities for the Stations of the Cross at Noon and 7 PM on Fridays.

- **Almsgiving:** Finally, all of our prayer, fasting and abstinence are meant to bear fruit in the form of almsgiving, by giving generously to our neighbors in need, both near and far. We are blessed to have numerous groups in our parish who work hard to provide us with opportunities to help others in need, such as the Social Justice Committee, Knights of Columbus and Altar & Rosary Society. Recently, we have had examples like the Mother Teresa Collection (Altar & Rosary Society), the Pancake Breakfast, which benefits the Pregnancy Resources Center (Knights of Columbus). This Lent, the Social Justice Committee will again be hosting the Trees for Haiti project (see this bulletin for details). Also, watch for upcoming information about the Altar & Rosary sponsored "Undies Sundays." Finally, don't forget that the April 8th Fish Fry (Knights of Columbus) will help provide scholarships to Saint Malachy high school seniors. But, don't stop there. Look for opportunities to help the people the Lord puts on your path.

May these and other opportunities help us all to draw nearer to the Lord, who draws so very near to us, so that we may share more fully in His Resurrection when the Easter Season arrives.

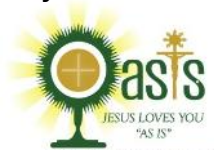

March Liturgy Leanings

Violet is on the altar for all Sundays in March.

March 2 Ash Wednesday - Ashes remind us we are sinners. Fasting, giving up something to focus on Christ's sacrifice on the cross for us. Prayer, to deepen our relationship with God, and almsgiving, to recognize the needs of others and to help them.

March 3 St. Katherine Drexel, Virgin, founded the Sisters of the Blessed Sacrament, that built schools for African and Native American populations across the US and established St. Xavier University to train teachers for these schools.

March 4 St. Casimir, born a prince of Poland, but lived a life of chastity, simplicity, and good works until his death in his mid twenties. He is the patron saint of all youth.

March 6 1st Sunday of Lent. A time to strengthen our attachment to God and a period of conversion and change of heart so we make God the center of our lives.

March 7 St. Perpetua, Noblewoman, and St. Felicity, Slave, both martyrs. They were both thrown to beasts in the Colosseum in 203 and died. They were friends, sisters, new mothers, and fellow martyrs.

March 8 St. John of God, Religious. Portuguese friar became a leading religious figure, distributed religious books using the Gutenberg printing press, cared for the mentally ill, and founded the Brothers Hospitallers of St. John of God.

March 9 St. Frances of Rome, Religious, although an arranged marriage initially prevented her from pursuing a call to a religious life. Her zeal for good works attracted a community of like-minded women who became the Oblates of Mary. The desire for her was finally fulfilled when her husband's death freed her to become its religious superior.

March 13 2nd Sunday of Lent. Changing to be more spiritual, that is, closer to God.

March 17 St. Patrick, Bishop. After escaping slavery in Ireland, this saint spent 22 years acquiring education and skills to return to Ireland as a missionary to God, converting thousands, and building church's and monasteries across Ireland.

March 18 St. Cyril of Jerusalem, Bishop and Doctor of the Church. Frequently embroiled in the conflicts over Arianism (simply teaches that Jesus was not God) and was exiled 3 times for his defenses of orthodoxy. His love for Jesus made him a natural preacher and teacher.

March 19 St. Joseph, Spouse of The Blessed Virgin Mary. Joseph was a just man who observed and revered the law. He was a humble carpenter and patron saint of workers. He had a deep faith and trust in God. He was a dutiful husband and protector of Mary and took care of Jesus.

March 20 3rd Sunday of Lent. In this week's gospel, Luke focuses on the need for human cooperation with a saving God, in the form of repentance.

March 23 St. Turibius of Mogrovejo, Bishop 16th century advocate and defender against mistreatment of the people of Peru at the hands of the Spanish conquerors.

March 27 4th Sunday of Lent. In the gospel of Luke this week, we learn about Jesus' mercy, The Prodigal Son.

TREES FOR HAITI

As you might know, Haiti is the poorest country in the Western Hemisphere and one of the poorest countries in the developing world. But you might not know that mass deforestation plays a role in continuing this extreme poverty. Deforestation has led to erosion and flooding, poor soil quality, a depletion of farmland, air pollution and a lack of water.

We have partnered with **Eden Reforestation Projects** to help improve this situation. Every single one of us can make a difference!

During Lent, Eden will plant one tree in Haiti for every 15 cents that we donate.

That means for just over a dollar, 7 trees will be planted and a \$15 donation buys 100 trees!

This is a great opportunity for Lenten Almsgiving!

Not only will we be supporting tree planting, but we will also be providing employment for the people of Haiti who will gather seeds, plant, and protect the trees. In this way, **Eden Reforestation Projects** empowers those who are suffering from the effects of deforestation to be part of the solution.

Planting trees promotes long term rehabilitation, not just short term relief.

You can donate any time during Lent at the display in the Narthex or place a check, made out to St. Malachy, in the offering basket with “Trees for Haiti” written in the memo line. A ribbon will be placed on the display tree for each \$15 donated—each ribbon represents 100 trees!

The Food Pantry gratefully accepts donations of food, personal care items, clothing, and household items during business hours: Mondays, Tuesdays, and Thursdays from 9:00-noon and 1:00-4:00, and Fridays from 9:00-noon. We also have a red donation drop box for food donations in the vestibule at Fareway for your convenience. Monetary donations may be made at geneseofoodpantry.org or mailed to: P.O. Box 324, Geneseo, IL 61254.

Residents of Geneseo or Atkinson who meet income guidelines may receive food once per month during business hours **or** by scheduling an evening appointment at geneseofoodpantry.org or call 944-3165. Any resident of Geneseo or Atkinson may shop in the clothing room once per week on Monday, Tuesday, or Thursday during business hours. The Food Pantry provides emergency assistance for rent or utility bills to residents of Geneseo or Atkinson. Those in need can visit the Food Pantry to fill out an application.

The Food Pantry provided food and other assistance to 70 households in January. Food distributions in January were equivalent to 2025 meals, made possible through our community's amazing support! We are truly grateful for the incredible support of our community.

The Scouting for Food Drive will take place on Saturday, March 19. If the Scouts put a tag on your doorknob, they will pick up food from your front porch and deliver it to the Food Pantry. This food drive helps the Food Pantry have enough food for the summer months when donations typically decrease.

Are you starting to plan your garden? Please consider planting an extra row for those who cannot afford to purchase fresh produce. Our clients truly appreciate the fresh fruits and vegetables donated from gardens in our community.

The Food Pantry is especially in need of 18-24 month clothing and larger size adult clothing. All clothing and household items are gratefully accepted.

Food needs for this month: Oatmeal, K cup coffee, juice, tortillas, and mayonnaise.

Non-food needs: Garbage bags, paper plates, gallon freezer bags, all-purpose cleaner, and size 4, 5, and 6 diapers.

The Food Pantry will be closed on Friday, April 15 in observance of Good Friday.
