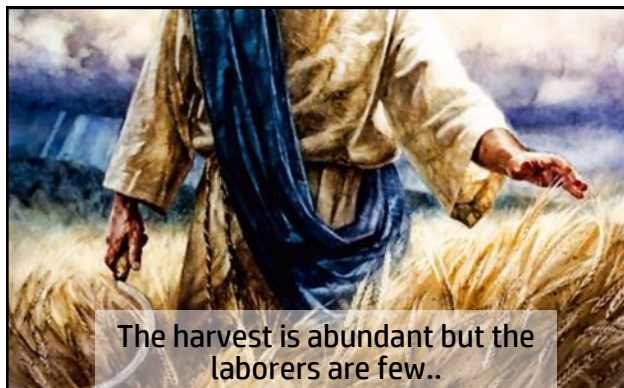



A Note From the Pastor

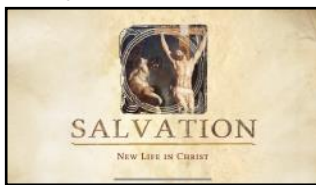
Dear St. Malachy Parishioners,

Welcome back to The Search and Where It Leads You. Last time in this series designed to explore places on Formed.org to dive deeper into the topics of each of the episodes of *The Search*, we began to explore the question of who Jesus is. Now, it is time to begin to appreciate what He has done for us, as we come to Episode 6: Am I Saved? This question is widely misunderstood, as we often think it is solely about our eternal destination beyond this life. While the salvation which Jesus Christ makes possible by His Passion, Death and Resurrection only reaches its fullness, finality and perfection in heaven, it is a gift that He wants to give us today. But, what does that mean? Does that mean that He wants to give a non-refundable, unconditionally redeemable ticket into heaven that never expires?! Not exactly. The gift of eternal life, which enables us to share in the very life of God - which is the ONLY way it could be eternal, because He alone is the Eternal One - is the gift that He gave us in Baptism. He calls us to preserve, cherish and care for this gift, by seeking to deepen our relationship with Him, to avoid sin and to allow Him to heal us from the sins into which we have already fallen by the Sacrament of Reconciliation. So, what exactly is He saving us from? He wants to save us from the only thing that can cause us to forfeit or damage that gift of eternal life: sin. Jesus wants to save us from sin TODAY. This means both embracing the mercy and forgiveness He offers us and also taking seriously the words He told the woman to whom He showed mercy in John 8. After demonstrating to her that she was not condemned, but that He was showing her mercy, He also told her: Go and sin no more. This not only called her to make the choice to turn from sin, but also reminded her that she was able to do so. Her future was not determined by her past. And neither is ours. We can begin again today. Jesus wants to set us free, by empowering us by His Merciful Love to turn away from sin and toward a deeper relationship with Him.

So, where can we go deeper into the mystery of salvation, with a thorough understanding of what the Sacred Scriptures teach us about this, especially in the New Testament? Well, one of the first quotes in this episode comes from Dr. Michael Barber. In this quote, he is basically summarizing an entire study of his, which you can find on the list of Bible Studies on Formed.org. This study is *Lectio: Salvation*. For those of you who are more readers than viewers, this is one of the studies that is based upon a book, namely *Salvation: What Every Catholic Should Know* by Dr. Michael Barber. Whether you view the study or read the book or both, Dr. Barber can help to lead you to a deeper understanding and appreciation of what the Bible really has to say about salvation. Ultimately, this is the gift that Jesus Christ came to give us. It's the gift He wants us to receive, cherish, and care for. And it's the gift that He wants us to share with the world. What better reason to embrace the opportunity to appreciate it more fully ourselves!

Abide in God's Presence: Living from the Source, Striving for the Summit, Christ as our Center. *"I have eagerly desired to eat this Passover with you before I suffer" (Luke 22:15).*

ALL SAINTS, ALL SOULS & SAINT MALACHY: This next week is filled with important days! We celebrate Halloween, because it is the Eve of All Saints Day (a holy day of obligation, for which we will have three opportunities for Mass, listed in this bulletin). This leads to All Souls Day, in which we especially pray for the souls of all who have gone before us. Finally, we will be continuing our novena during this week, because this leads to the celebration of the Feast of Saint Malachy next weekend: November 5-6. As I have said in recent homilies, this week serves as a kind of "Check-Point" on the finishing stretch of the Church Year, which concludes with Christ the King (November 19-20th).

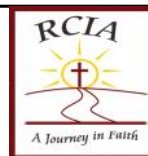

Liturgy Leanings for November, 2022

November is the “Month of All Souls;” On November 20, the season of Ordinary Time and the Year C cycle of readings will conclude as the Church celebrates the feast of “Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe.” The final weekend of November, the 27th-28th, begins a new liturgical year, and the season of Advent. With the beginning of a new liturgical year, the Church also begins a new cycle of readings - Year A; The Gospels of Saint Matthew are featured during Year A. Violet is the color of the season of Advent.

Father Gifford has transferred the feast day of Saint Malachy, the patron saint of our parish, from November 3rd to the first Sunday of the month, November 6th. Saint Malachy was born in 1095 at Armagh, Ireland, and was ordained for the priesthood when he was 25 years old. He became a bishop five years later, and worked to re-establish and unify the Catholic faith in Ireland. He would seek out the people in their fields and their homes when they did not come to church. He was the Bishop of Armagh from 1129-1148 and was canonized in 1190 by Pope Clement III.

Saints whose memorials are observed during November include:

- 11/1—All Saints’ Day is a Holy Day of Obligation: Masses will be at 8:00 a. m., 9:00 a. m. (school), and 5:45 p. m. May we be inspired to imitate not only the lives of the canonized saints, but also those whom we have known who we believe are living forever in heaven with God
- 11/2—All Souls’ Day: We especially think of those who have died since last All Souls’ Day; the souls of all who have died are honored throughout the month of November
- 11/13—Saint Frances Xavier Cabrini: an Italian immigrant, she founded the Missionary Sisters of the Sacred Heart, and became a naturalized citizen of this country in 1909. After her death in Chicago in 1917, reports of some 150,000 miracles flooded the Vatican; she was canonized in 1946 by Pope Pius XII, the first U. S. citizen to be canonized; her national shrine is in Chicago
- 11/18—Saint Rose Philippine Duchesne came to Missouri to educate Native Americans and the poor of St. Louis; a member of the Society of the Sacred Heart, she and the sisters established orphanages and schools across this country. She was canonized by Pope John Paul II on July 3, 1988; her national shrine is in St. Charles, Missouri
- 11/22—Saint Cecilia, a third-century martyr who died because she would not forsake her vow of virginity or make sacrifices to the gods; she is the patron saint of musicians, singers and poets
- 11/30—Saint Andrew, Apostle: the first of the Twelve to meet and follow Jesus, he brought his brother, Simon Peter, to Jesus
