A Note From the Pastor

Dear St. Malachy Parishioners,

“The Eucharist, as Pope Benedict XVI teaches in Sacramentum Caritatis (The Sacrament of Charity), is a mystery to be believed, celebrated and lived.” These words of Timothy P. O’Malley, in his book *Becoming Eucharistic People: The Hope and Promise of Parish Life* (our Christmas gift this year) is a fitting starting point for multiple reasons. First, as the whole Church mourns the passing of Benedict XVI, our Pope Emeritus after his passing on New Year’s Eve, it is no surprise that such a clear, concise and yet beautiful description of the mystery of the Eucharist is a reference to the beloved former pope, who happens to be one of the greatest teachers of the faith in our time. Secondly, in so few words, it says so much that we have been discussing over the course of the first half of this Year of Presence, namely that the Eucharist is the Source, Summit and Center of our lives. O’Malley summarizes Benedict as saying simply that the Eucharist is “a mystery to be believed, celebrated and lived.” As the Summit toward which we are striving, it must be *believed*, both trusting that it is what Christ and His Church tell us it is and also hoping in it. As the Center of our lives, it must be *celebrated*, with reverent devotion and love. And as the Source of the grace to live differently, it also must be *lived*, meaning beyond the celebration itself. The Eucharist calls us to live differently. Fittingly, then, O’Malley sets out to explore the question of what it means to live eucharistically, not only individually, but as a parish.

When I discussed the Eucharistic Revival in the Christmas Homily, I alluded to the fact that, while the first half of the Year of Presence was largely me teaching about the Eucharist, the second half will be more about extending invitations to Come, Adore Him. One of these invitations will include special monthly Holy Hours offered for specific needs, including opportunities to give to those needs. The focus for each of these Holy Hours will be based upon the Spiritual and Corporal Works of Mercy, which resonates with O’Malley’s discussion of “Eucharistic Works of Mercy” (pgs. 106-8). These will take place in the last hour of our weekly Monday Adoration (3-8 PM), allowing those who cannot come to the hour itself to come and bring an offering, as they come to pray at an earlier hour.

The first of these will be the Holy Hour for Life (Monday, January 23) and is a fitting reflection for this weekend’s celebration of the Epiphany of the Lord. When the Magi came to adore the Newborn King, they came with gifts. Similarly, the loving concern that beckons us to come to the Lord first is for children waiting to be born and for their parents, who often find themselves in desperate need. We will be meeting on the Day of Prayer for the Legal Protection of Unborn Children to pray for life and to bring offerings to benefit Pregnancy Resources and Women’s Choice Center.

When we consider this first Holy Hour in light of the “Eucharistic Works of Mercy,” the first connection that comes to mind is simply the final spiritual work of mercy (in most lists): to pray for the living and the dead. We pray in mournful sorrow for the souls of innocent children lost by abortion, but we do so filled with hope, not only for their eternal salvation, but also for the living for whom we pray: for the children whose lives can still be saved and the parents who can still be spared from the deep wound that this tragic choice leaves behind. Yet, this is only the beginning. In these centers of hope for mothers, children and fathers, other works of mercy are worked, often in life-changing ways. I think of the opportunity I had to interview Sarah Jansen from Women’s Choice Center on Thursday Thoughts last October. She shared how often women come to them hearing many voices telling them “you can’t do this” (meaning carry this child to term) and she has the opportunity to perhaps be the first one to tell them, “I think you can and I want to help you.” This paints a picture of a place of safe refuge for pregnant women in need, where the misinformed are instructed, the doubtful are counseled, and afflicted are comforted, in addition to the resources provided to help meet their material needs. This is just the first of many. Please consider being a part of these Holy Hours inspired by the “Eucharistic Works of Mercy.”

Come, Let Us Adore Him. Heavenly Father,... Center us and feed us by the gift of the Eucharist that we may be strengthened for our mission. Amen.*

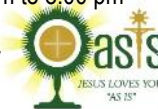
