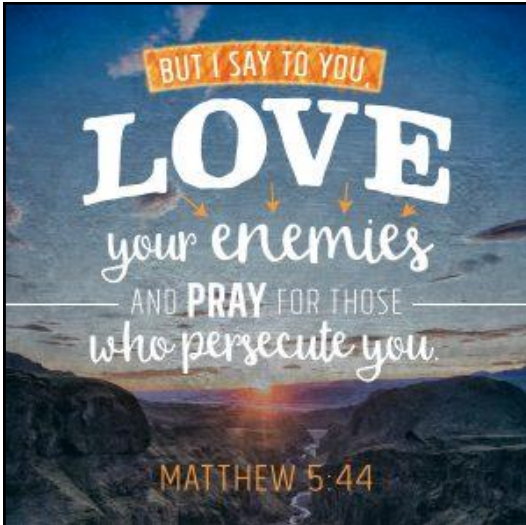

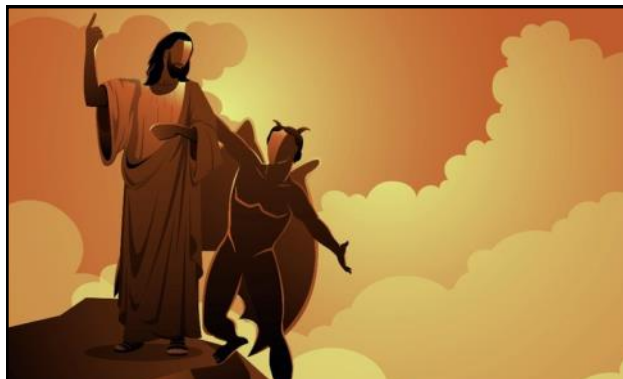

A Note From the Pastor

Dear St. Malachy Parishioners,

"Love your enemies and pray for those who persecute you, that you may be children of your heavenly Father" (Matthew 5:44-45). These words from this weekend's Gospel are very challenging. They remind me of another man of great peace, after the example of Christ: Saint Francis of Assisi. This month, I have had the opportunity to teach our children at Saint Malachy School and CCD about him and some of his followers. I began giving it the nickname, "Franciscan February." Fittingly, at the same time, many of our adult parishioners are engaged in our current Bible Study, *Metanoia*, from the inspiring video series by Father Dave Pivonka, a Franciscan priest, who occasionally passes along little nuggets of Franciscan spirituality.

During my lessons for Franciscan February, one striking similarity struck me between some of the fascinating stories of the early Franciscans. Saint Clare once brought peace to Assisi by her prayers, when a battle was threatening the safety of its people. Saint Anthony once brought peace to Padua by his preaching, as the city was greatly troubled by crime at the time that the peaceful and holy preacher arrived in town. Perhaps it is fitting that this Franciscan February also includes the Holy Hour for Peace (Monday, February 20 at 7 PM, including a collection for relief for Ukraine).

Both Clare and Anthony had already answered a call to come to Christ and seek Him alone, even living a life of voluntary poverty. I think of some of the elements of Franciscan prayer, which Fr. Dave emphasizes in *Metanoia*: especially, the willingness to let go of anything that stands in the way of my relationship with the Lord and the principle that when I go to pray, Jesus is already there waiting for me. A disciple lives... in God's Presence. With all of this in mind, it becomes clear to see how these holy men and women could be such people of peace. Peace begins in the heart.

As we consider, then, the call of Lent, beginning in just a few days, we recognize the Lord is asking us to meet Him in the desert, for a season of prayer, fasting, and almsgiving. We go there to meet Him. We will not be alone. He is already there waiting for us. May we prayerfully keep our hearts open to all that


the Lord wants for us, as we discern a personal "plan" for our Lent this year. May Lent in the Year of Presence be for you and for all of us a time to rediscover that peace of heart that bears good fruit in the peace that we show toward others.

All of the saints spent lots of time in prayer. The reason? These wise men and women realized that prayer—ongoing conversation or relationship with God—is essential to living the Christian life. Prayer powers the spiritual life. When we pray, we are better able to let God work through us instead of trying to “do it ourselves.”

Some ways to help in your prayer:

Put out holy water: You can underline the connection between Lent and baptism by making Holy water available for your family to bless themselves...at the beginning of the day, or when they go out.

Pray the Rosary throughout the day: Family members can carry the Rosary, using it to pray throughout the day.

Go to Confession: If your family hasn't been to confession this year, make it a priority to go during Lent. If you do celebrate the sacrament of Reconciliation regularly, try to increase your frequency during Lent. Go as a family and then celebrate together afterward.

Get to know Jesus: Get to know Jesus by reading the Gospels during Lent, you could read it together as a family.

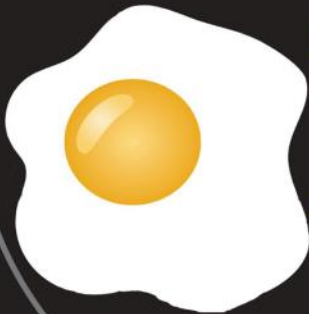

Geneseo-Atkinson Food Pantry March 2023 Newsletter

The Geneseo-Atkinson Food Pantry is open: Mondays 9:00 am to 7:00 pm; Tuesdays and Thursdays 9:00 am to 4:00 pm; and Fridays 9:00 am to 12:00 pm. Food is distributed, and donations are gratefully accepted during business hours. We also have collection boxes in the vestibule at Fareway and at Inspire Continuing Care for donations. The Clothing room is open to all residents of Geneseo and Atkinson on Monday, Tuesday, and Thursday. The Food Pantry will be closed on Good Friday, April 7.

Because of the community's generous support, the Food Pantry provided food and emergency assistance to 134 households in January. Combined food distributions in January were equivalent to 5,469 meals. Thanks to the many donors who make all this possible!

The Food Pantry partners with Unity Point to provide two Foot Care Clinics to the public each month. Nurses soak feet, trim and file toenails, help with ingrown toenails, and give a light foot massage with lotion. Please call 309-944-3165 or email geneseopantry1@gmail.com to make an appointment. Cost is \$37 but Food Pantry guests are given a voucher.

Dietitians from Hammond-Henry Hospital taught a free Heart Health class on February 21 in the Matthew 25 Center at the Food Pantry. Guests were provided with recipes for lower cost healthy dishes, a cooking demonstration, and free samples of healthy food. The Dietitians will be back to teach a Heart Healthy Cooking Class on March 7 at 10:00, and the public is invited.

As the weather starts to warm up, the clothing room is especially in need of spring clothing, sheets, new women's underwear, and any clothing size 3XL or larger. The Food Pantry accepts any size clothing, accessories, kitchenware, decorations, books, games, toys, movies, and other household items.

Our Volunteer of the Month, Julie Fiers, has been volunteering at the Food Pantry for three months. She greets guests and listens to their needs, assists them in selecting nutritious food, provides ideas for food preparation and keeps shelves organized. Julie has a husband Steve, son Hunter, and dog Stu. She enjoys walking outside, exercising, decorating, cooking, reading, watching movies, and traveling with her husband. Julie said she is in awe at how hard the Food Pantry staff works at providing the most useful offerings to individuals and families, and the Food Pantry is a beautiful facility. Thank you for your time and hard work, Julie!

Your child can attend a Catholic School Financial Assistance Available



Tuition assistance scholarship grants from the endowment fund established as a result of the Diocese of Peoria ROOTED IN FAITH Campaign and named in honor of Archbishop Spalding, the first Bishop of Peoria, will be available for the 2023-2024 school year for students enrolled in or intending to enroll in grades Kindergarten through 12 in any Catholic school located in the Diocese of Peoria whose families are active members of a Catholic parish in the diocese. All grants will be based on financial need objectively assessed.

Information about the grants and application materials may be obtained from any Catholic elementary or secondary school in the Diocese of Peoria or on the Diocesan website www.cdop.org under **Catholic Education** and then under **Financial Assistance**. Consult the detailed protocols and procedures and checklist for all requirements necessary to be eligible for an award.

Parents must apply online at: online.factsmgt.com/aid. Families of students currently receiving grants are reminded that all grants are for one year only, and anyone seeking to renew a grant for the 2023-2024 school year must reapply.

Deadline date for the completed application is April 28, 2023. Notification of grant awards will be made in June of 2023.

Another funding opportunity is also available due to the Invest in Kids Act legislation in Illinois. Students may be eligible for up to 100% of tuition and fees under a new program for tax credit scholarships (TCS). Details on how to apply and who qualifies are available on the Empower Illinois website at www.empowerillinois.org. Students who receive a TCS are ineligible to receive a Spalding award.
