

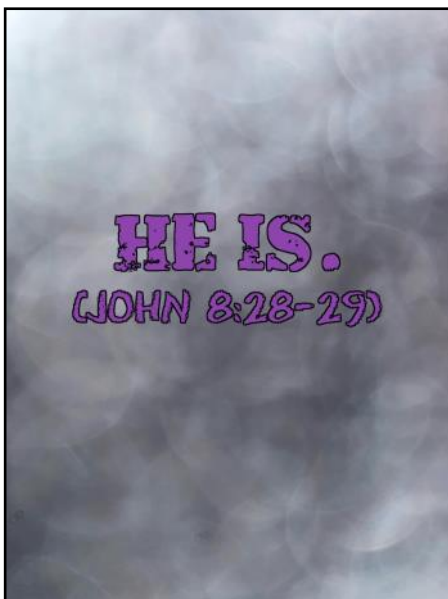

A Note From the Pastor

Dear St. Malachy Parishioners,

HE IS. *"When you lift up the Son of Man, then you will realize that I AM, and that I do nothing on my own, but I say only what the Father taught me. The one who sent me is with me. He has not left me alone, because I always do what is pleasing to him"* (John 8:28-29). By now, we have made the shift in the Lectionary from Matthew to John.

Matthew will be back when we return to Ordinary Time and he will also show up a few times before then. But, it is part of the holy seasons to set aside the Gospel for the year, in order to journey awhile with John. These days find us 'in the thick' of Lent, so it's fitting that we have begun to take up that final Gospel, which was written later, with the Spirit's gift of understanding. John was an eyewitness of all that took place. But, that was just the beginning. He had many years afterwards for the seeds that were planted in his heart and mind to begin to take root and grow, to begin to understand all that the Lord was revealing to them. Thus, it is very clear in the Gospel of John that the One who took on flesh and dwelt among us in none other than the Eternal God. He Is. The One who identified Himself to Moses words, "I Am Who Am" is the same One who fasted in the desert in order to prepare for His mission to save our souls, the same One who died for us when that mission reached its climax... and the same One who rose again. The Eternal God entered into time. So, John begins His Gospel by reflecting on the eternity of the Word of God, who took on flesh in the Person of Jesus Christ. And he will also recount moments like this one (in John 8:28-29), in which He told us clearly that He is the same I AM... but that they would not understand Him right away. They would only understand when they lift Him up on the cross, when they see Him suffering.

What a profound mystery: the Eternal God enters into time to meet us in the present moment. Yet, there is more still: we recognize the Eternal God entering into the present moment to meet us when we see Him suffering.

He told His disciples that He would come to them in the suffering. *"I was hungry and you gave me food, I was thirsty and you gave me drink, a stranger and you welcomed me, naked and you clothed me, ill and you cared for me, in prison and you visited me" ... 'Amen, I say to you, whatever you did for one of these least brothers of mine,*

you did for me" (Matthew 25:35-40). If we have ever failed to recognize Christ the Lord coming to us in the poor, we can understand how the Church would not want us to miss Him when He comes to us in the distressing disguise of the poorest of the poor. And so, from this and other passages of Scripture, the Church has compiled and passed down the Works of Mercy, as a reminder to all of us that when we feed the hungry, clothe the naked and shelter the homeless, the God of Mercy is present and at work. He is not only at work in the life of the one in need, who is being served. He is also profoundly present and at work in the life of the one who is ministering to His needs: *"Whatever you did for one of these least brothers of mine, you did for me."*

This Monday (March 20th @ 7 PM) all are welcome to join us for the **Holy Hour for the Homeless**. The Eternal God will be with us, in the Holy Eucharist. And we will be doing our very small part to "shelter the homeless" by taking up a collection for Humility Homes. However, may it also be a time to ask the Lord to open our eyes, in order to recognize Him when He comes into us in the moment, in the distressing disguise of the poorest of the poor.

At the conclusion of every Holy Hour, we sing the classic hymn by Saint Thomas Aquinas, *Down in Adoration Falling (Tantum Ergo)*. May we consider the layers of meaning in the words of this hymn: *"Faith will tell us Christ is present, when our human senses fail."* Indeed, faith will tell us Christ is present in the Eucharist, when we fail to recognize Him, when we see only a piece of unleavened bread. But, this is simply training for our eyes of faith to keep looking for Him. Faith will also tell us Christ is present when we fail to recognize Him, but only see a person asking us for a handout, a burden or a bother. May this time of adoration and prayer open our eyes to recognize when the same Eternal God who was born on Christmas Day, healed and taught the multitudes, died on Good Friday, and rose on Easter Sunday... enters into our lives and meets us in the present moment. May every encounter we have with Christ in the Eucharist open our eyes to recognize him.



FASTING

Fasting and abstinence are the practice of giving up something in order to offer a sacrifice of love to God who gave Himself for us, to turn away from sin and draw closer to him. The thing we give up might be good in itself, but we relinquish it in order to focus on the greater good...God. Fasting is not only a form of penance, but a spiritual discipline.

Here are a few ideas of fasting:

Transform bedrooms into "deserts": We can imitate Jesus' time in the desert by making our room more desert-like as well, storing away all but the most essential items during Lent.

Slim down wardrobes: Count up the number of outfits you have and select 10% to wear during Lent. For inspiration, read stories of saints who gave away their clothes to the poor.

Donate some of the clothes by the end of Lent.

Write that fight: Cut down the number of family squabbles by committing to writing down your complaints rather than making them verbal. Print "complaint forms" with guidelines for rephrasing complaints using respectful language.

Give up your place: If your family is always fighting about who gets to sit where or who gets to be first, then read and talk about Jesus' teaching about "first" and "last" place: Mark 10:41-45. Challenge your family to live that teaching during Lent.

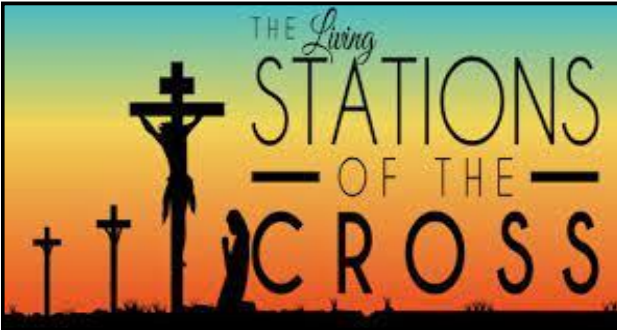
