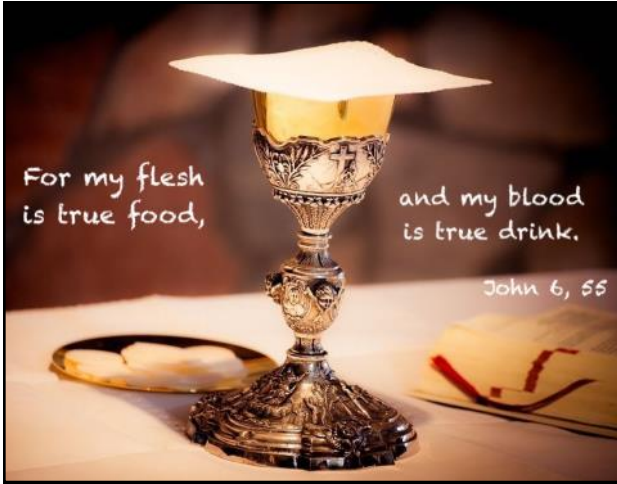

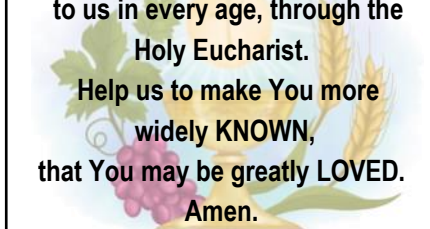

A Note From the Pastor

Dear St. Malachy Parishioners,

“Remember how... the LORD, your God, has directed all your journeying... He therefore let you be afflicted with hunger, and then fed you with manna, a food unknown to you and your fathers, in order to show you that not by bread alone does one live, but by every word that comes forth from the mouth of the LORD.” (Deuteronomy 8). These words of Our Lord in our First Reading this weekend were a fitting prelude to the past couple of weeks, as the Lord began directing my journeying through a period of affliction, in the midst of which He has fed me with Holy Word. He has not abandoned me and I hope you know that neither does He abandon you in times of affliction. I am writing this letter from my hospital room in Iowa City, which has become a different kind of home for over a week now, as the doctor's work to identify and treat the root causes of the blood clot near my kidney, which began causing me intense pain on the evening of Memorial Day. We are making progress, not only in recovery, but working toward a final diagnosis and treatment plan. That latter process may continue through outpatient follow-ups. So, while I still don't have a date for my departure, I am optimistic that perhaps by the time you are reading this, I may even be back with you at the parish. As this process continues, please know that the best way to support me is to continue the prayers and refrain from asking questions. Thank you so much for all of your prayers and support. They have been part of how the Lord has reminded me that He has faithfully directed my journey through each step.

Still, it's common to ask, why? If the Lord is directing all of our journeying, why does He lead us down paths of affliction, at times. Well, that is complicated. It takes faith and much patience to begin to see His hand at work, bringing great good even from deep suffering. Still, often, the final answer to each “why” may even wait for eternity.

While I could go over a long list of principles to apply while wrestling with the more difficult “why” questions of life, the Lord has been speaking to my heart by simply inviting me to consider how Moses, at the end of his life, was able to see the guiding hand of the Lord, who He identified last week as *“a merciful and gracious God, slow*

to anger and rich in kindness and fidelity,” even in their most trying moments. And he invited the people to understand: *“He therefore let you be afflicted with hunger, and then fed you with manna, a food unknown to you and your fathers, in order to show you that not by bread alone does one live, but by every word that comes forth from the mouth of the LORD.”* It is such a consolation for me that, on the day that my present little journey through affliction would begin, the Lord had given me this reading for my daily meditation, as I began preparing for this weekend's ***Solemn Feast of Corpus Christi!***

Through these words of Moses, the Lord tells us that sometimes He allows affliction, not only to make us stronger (it won't necessarily do that on its own), but to remind us where our strength comes from! Our strength comes from the Lord alone. Meanwhile, Corpus Christi and this Eucharistic Revival have been reminding us how it is that He strengthens us, namely through the Holy Eucharist. The Eucharist is the Source of our strength, as well the Summit toward which we are journeying and the Center of our lives. You may be thinking, “Well, I can think of plenty of other ways that He strengthens us.” Absolutely, He wants to strengthen us through daily prayer, through the Scriptures, through other good spiritual readings, through the beauty of His creation, perhaps through a moving song lyric reflecting His truth, and certainly through the witness, support and fraternity of friends and family. Recently, I am quite certain that He strengthened me through the smile of a small child wanting to play peekaboo in a waiting room where I had been sitting in pain for a long time. Each of these moments are steps along the journey toward the Summit, always with Christ as our Center. When we speak of the Eucharist as Source of our strength, this shouldn't be understood apart from Summit and Center. Holding all three together helps us see it, not merely as more important than all others parts of our journey, but intimately connected to every step of the journey.

A year ago (Corpus Christi 2022), we began renewing and deepening our understanding and appreciation of all this. Here at Saint Malachy, we have been referring to that first year as the Year of Presence: a year to rediscover the gift of the Real Presence of Jesus Christ in the Eucharist. We focused on living in His Presence, not only by coming to the Sunday Mass, but by allowing this Eucharistic Encounter to truly be our own

personal Source, Summit and Center.

Now that we know WHO is our strength (the Lord) and have had a whole year to focus on HOW He strengthens us, now we turn from the who and the how to the WHY. What is this strength given for? Ultimately, to get us to heaven. But it's for today too and we have a mission while we're here. So consider now the second part of the Saint Malachy Prayer: *Lord Jesus Christ, You have made Yourself PRESENT to us in every age, through the Holy Eucharist. **Help us to make You more widely KNOWN**, that You may be greatly LOVED. Amen.*

Friends, since He has made Himself Present in this incredible way, we must make Him known. So, I am pleased to announce the beginning of the **Year of Missionary**

Discipleship. In the coming weeks and months, I will have more opportunities to share more with you about that theme, its meaning, how we live it out, our theme verse and a variety of other ways we will be going deeper in this second year of the Eucharistic Revival. Let the journey continue, one step at a time. God bless you all.

Excerpt from the Pentecost Letter By Bishop Tylka

Evangelization:

Flowing from our understanding of being a disciple, the natural progression is to become an evangelizer of the relationship with Jesus, Jesus' presence and love transforms who we are and is so powerful that we desire to share the experience with others. Evangelization is the "big word" that essentially means the sharing of our faith. We share with others our experience of the encounter with Jesus so that they too may seek the same encounter. The Holy Spirit evangelizes through us and uses us as his instruments. To that end, progress is being made as we look to transform our parishes into evangelization centers: places where people can come for the authentic experience of meeting Jesus. However, it is not enough for us to provide a place where folks need to come, we must be willing to go out to meet people. Many feel they are not adequately prepared for the task of evangelization. So efforts have begun to overcome this hurdle of self-doubt by developing opportunities that allow people to unpack the notion. Here, I might suggest another book that has been given to all our priests and Curia, *Start with Jesus* by Julianne Stanz. It offers insights to our calling to be an evangelizing Church.

Before moving on to comment on the three remaining foundations, I wish to highlight the efforts of the Diocesan Curia that are focused on strengthening the awareness that we are called to be evangelizing disciples. Mr. Matthew Faley joined our staff as the Chief of Mission last September. A primary task of his is to assist all of us - in our parishes and in the Curia - to remain focused on the mission: "Go Make Disciples." As we renew our efforts, we earnestly desire to encourage and support our priests, religious, and parishes in their efforts to promote on a daily basis our calling to follow the Lord.
