

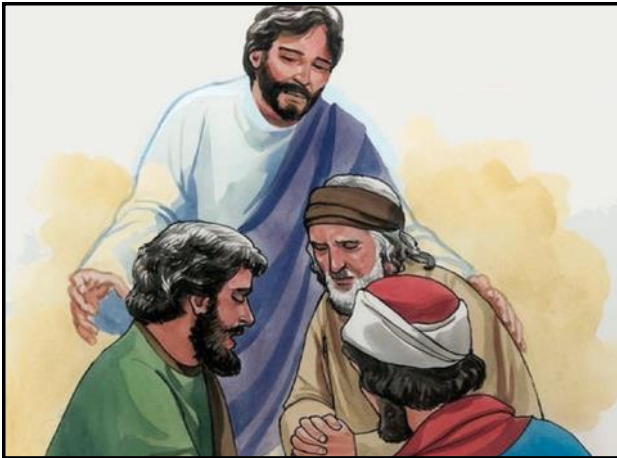

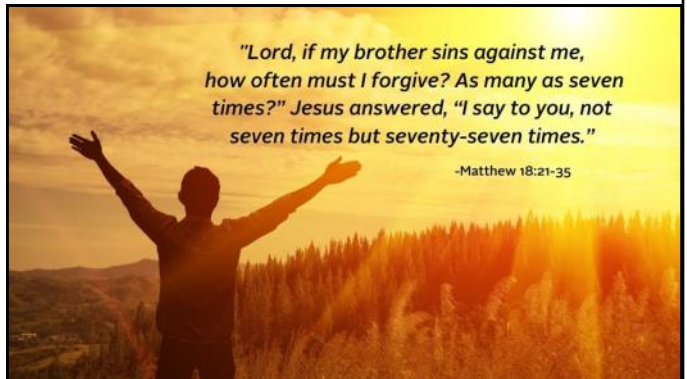

A Note From the Pastor



Dear St. Malachy Parishioners,

"Why does Jesus look like bread?" The simple brilliance of this question, uttered recently by one of our first graders during All-School Adoration, captures perfectly the wonder that the Eucharist is meant to inspire within us. It can be difficult to wrap

our minds around how this can be, that Jesus is TRULY PRESENT to us in the Holy Eucharist, under the appearance of bread and wine. In short, the fact that it's REALLY HIM, that it's not just a symbol, is truly an awesome mystery. We cannot stumble easily into such a mystery. Rather, such mysteries have a way of drawing us into themselves. And as we enter in, we might notice the perplexity in our minds progressing from "how can this be" to simply "can this be; is it really possible?" Besides the angel's words to Mary, "All things are possible for God," another of the gifts God gives us to address this question is that of the many Eucharistic Miracles that have occurred all over the world, throughout the generations. When someone struggles to believe in the Real Presence, sometimes the priest himself and sometimes the faithful, miracles sometimes happen. Yet, these miracles sometimes remain "best kept secrets." It might be said that part of the mission of Mission Month is to let the secret out. I hope that you can join us this Wednesday night (September 13 @ 6 PM) for the Real Presence Presentation for adults and teens on Eucharistic Miracles. Also, don't forget the open hours over the weekend for **The Vatican International Exhibition of the Eucharistic Miracles of the World**. These can be great opportunities to invite others to come and discover the beautiful mystery of the Eucharist in a deeper way.

However, this isn't the only thing to which we can be inviting friends, family and neighbors. As you may have seen the past few weeks, this is also the prime time to be inviting people to consider OCIA (formerly known as RCIA). We are hosting an informational night on September 26th, the week before the class starts.

Sometimes a simple invitation to an event can be a great way to open up the possibility of having a

conversation about the faith with a friend, family member or neighbor. But, sometimes, we may find these conversations difficult. Here are two basic recommendations: First, ask one simple question, "How can I pray for you?" If you are willing to actually stop and pray with them right then and there, that can be even more impactful. Regardless, asking what their needs and concerns are, ready to listen with a sincere and compassionate heart and to bring those needs before the Lord in prayer, is what is most important. Not every response will be the same, but it is still a great question to ask.

Second, share a bit of your own story, either of a way in which the Lord has been at work in your life presently or through the years. Share your own testimony and ask the person about their own walk with the Lord and how they have seen Him at work in their life. I recommend starting to practice these two conversations with one another, within the Body of Christ, as well as with our neighbors.

Now that we have begun this Mission Month, this is a great time to pray with these words from Luke's Gospel, in order that we all may more enthusiastically embrace the mission of making Him more widely known. *"They set out at once and returned to Jerusalem where they found gathered together the eleven and those with them... Then the two recounted what had taken place on the way and how he was made known to them in the breaking of the bread"* (Luke 24:33,35).

Sound System Upgrades: As you may know, we have been investigating the effectiveness of our sound system and the possibility of upgrading for some time now. Recently, we had an upgrade installed, in the form of four additional speakers, midway through the nave. These speakers are able to bring the sound closer to more of the people in the pews. In these first weeks with these adjustments to the system, any feedback you may wish to give would help us get things set up as best as we can.

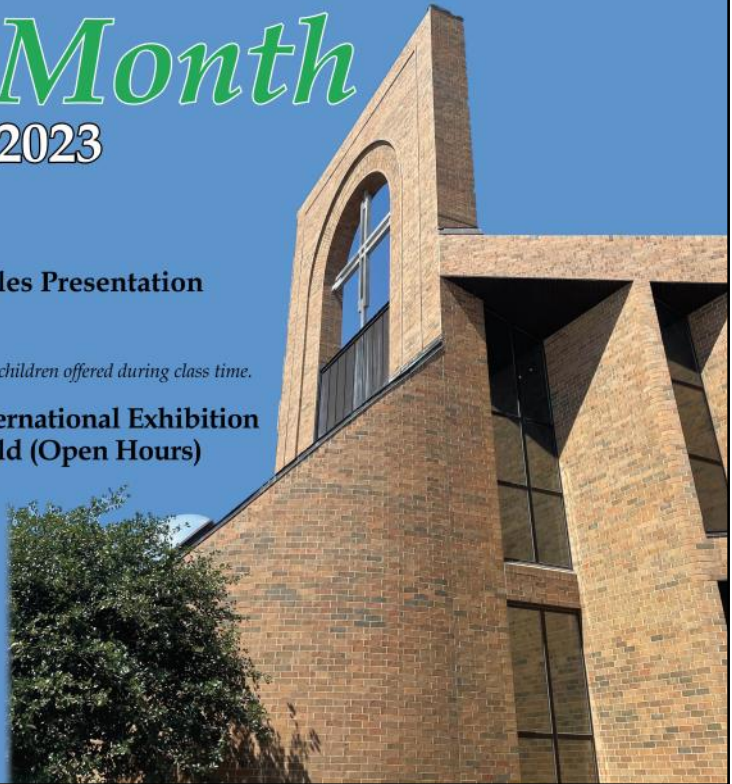

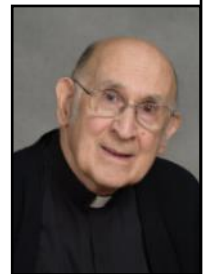

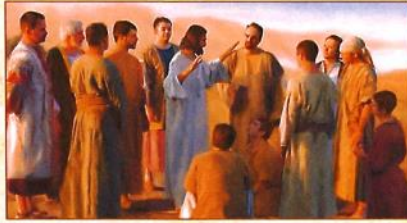

Frequently Asked Questions

What is the Annual Diocesan Appeal?

The Annual Diocesan Appeal is an annual invitation to all of the faithful in the Diocese of Peoria to contribute for the common good and impact lives beyond the scope of any individual parish. It includes ministries that bring comfort to our seniors, food to the hungry, education to all who desire to join the Catholic Faith, training to our seminarians, Pre-Cana for engaged couples, adult faith formation, support for parishes and leadership in our schools so that the next generation will carry on the Catholic Faith that we so lovingly cherish. Every parishioner is prayerfully asked for financial support.

Is there a minimum I need to donate?

There is no minimum. All gifts are gratefully accepted and valued. As stewards, we should take the time to reflect on our God given gifts of time, talent and treasure. Charitable giving is a reflection of our Christian Stewardship of treasure. All gifts to ADA are tax deductible and each donor will receive a tax letter from the Development Office in January.

How can I make my gift?

There are three types of gifts to the Appeal – pledge, one-time or recurring. Payments of cash, check, credit card and direct debit can be made by mail, online or via electronic giving. Monthly reminders (November-June) can also be mailed to donors for pledge payments. Gifts of appreciated stock, grain, qualified charitable distributions (QCDs) or donor advised funds have special considerations and requirements. Contact 309-671-1550 for more information.

Why should I contribute?

The Church in our diocese certainly needs the financial support of its Catholic faithful. But more importantly, because, as Catholics, we are part of the Mystical Body of Christ, we are called to share with each other the gifts He has given us. In contributing to the Appeal, you are responding to the call to be active participants within the universal Church.

How does the ADA benefit my parish and me?

Every Appeal gift goes to support diocesan programs and ministries which in turn provide services that no one parish can offer on its own. The Annual Diocesan Appeal most likely funded the education of the priests currently serving in your parish. Hundreds of young people annually participate in youth rally. Engaged couples receive marriage preparation through the Office of Evangelization and Faith Formation. Young men from our parishes attend Emmaus Days, vocation awareness program set in a spiritual but also fun environment. Many parishes host Totus Tuus summer program for children which is coordinated by our Office of Vocations. **In addition, any money that is paid over the parish's goal will be returned to the parish for its own programs and services.**

Are ADA funds used to pay legal fees or settlements from sexual abuse cases?

The Annual Diocesan Appeal supports the work of the Church in the Diocese of Peoria. All funds raised will be used exclusively and solely to support the programs and ministries of the Diocese. **No monies donated to the ADA have been or will be used to defray expenses related to misconduct issues.**
