A Note From the Pastor



Dear St. Malachy Parishioners,

“Your heart shall throb and overflow,” says the prophet Isaiah of the day when “the glory of the Lord shines upon you.” (Isaiah 60). These words actually come from last weekend’s readings, but I want to share a bit about a beautiful homily I heard on them last weekend, which is quite fitting for our return to Ordinary Time. While I was visiting my alma mater, Immaculate Heart of Mary Seminary in Winona, Minnesota, Fr. Bob Horihan (the current rector of the seminary) began his homily focusing on those words as he spoke to a group of seminarians who had just finished their annual silent retreat. At such times, we can experience this throbbing and overflowing of the heart when we recognize the Love of God being lavished upon us. Yet, he cautioned as we celebrated the Epiphany, we must continue to follow the star shining as our guide. While the star that shone for the magi was leading them to Christ, our star is Christ Himself. Just as when we leave the artificial lights of the city we can see the stars more clearly, so also we can see the star that is Christ with greater brilliance and clarity when we are given a privileged time to be able to focus upon His Light. This is certainly true of a time of retreat, but it can also be true of holy seasons such as Advent and Christmas. And so, Fr. Bob’s warning to the seminarians returning from retreat applies to us as we return to Ordinary Time. Like the return to the city, many other lights will offer themselves to us, telling us that they are enough and that we can live our lives by their light. We must not believe this. Forget not that throbbing and overflowing of the heart, when the Love of God was lavished upon you. Follow the star that is Christ.




This homily is one of a variety of reasons that I am grateful for my short little vacation last week. My visit to the seminary also gave me a chance to visit the seven seminarians for our diocese who are studying there (the others study at Mundelein or Mount St. Mary’s). You may recognize some of them (see picture). Nate Devlin grew up in our parish and still visits often, as he still has family members here. Jarod Raber and Peter Schoonmaker were both here for Totus Tuus and Peter made a separate visit to our school. And Brady DePoorter often attends Mass here. It was good to be with them, to pray with them and hopefully offer them some encouragement. Let us keep them in our prayers and continue to pray for more young men to answer the call to discern the priesthood in seminary, especially from our own parish.

Finally, my time away also included a brief stop at the Seek Conference, hosted by the Fellowship of Catholic University Students (FOCUS) in St. Louis. There, I was able to attend a talk on faith, charity and the Eucharist and to encounter many friends both old and new from everywhere. This included three of our other Totus Tuus missionaries from this

past summer (Caitlyn, Maria and Faustina). And also two of our parishioners: Kobe Duda (who was attending with the University of Illinois) and Kimberly Souba (who was a part of a group of parish employees recruited by Bishop Lou to attend the conference). This conference was very much in line with our theme for this Year of Missionary Discipleship. FOCUS has been one of the groups leading the way for a long time, in helping young Catholics, and more recently also Catholics of all ages, to grow into intentional disciples of Jesus Christ, who make disciples of others.

Let us continue to pray that we may experience this in an ever deeper way right here in Geneseo. Let us follow the star that is Christ and invites others onto the journey. "They set out at once and returned to Jerusalem where they found gathered together the eleven and those with them... Then the two recounted what had taken place on the way and how he was made known to them in the breaking of the bread" (Luke 24:33,35).

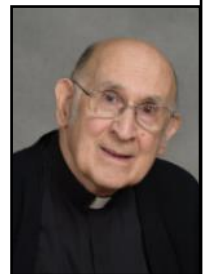

St Malachy Memories

Saint Malachy School Days 1949 - 1956 - Ted McAvoy

I first went to St. Malachy in 1949 when starting 2nd grade. I had attended 1st grade in a one-room rural school with a total of 16 students in all eight grades. I really enjoyed it... we had a whole acre of playground, and when our teacher was working with other grades, us younger grades would have a short recess multiple times a day.

In the fall of 1949, the Geneseo Unit District was formed, and a great many rural schools were closed, and those that were still open were either 1st, 2nd, and 3rd grade centers, or they were 4th, 5th, and 6th grade centers. My father, Sherman McAvoy had attended the one room McAvoy School through 6th grade and then St. Malachy for 7th and 8th, so he sent my sister and me to St. Malachy. So, off to 2nd grade at this really big building with 120 kids or so. Wow! There was a postage stamp sized asphalt playground ruled by everyone older than us, regimented recess time, lunch in the basement with strict rules. I had a tough time adjusting. There were daily recitations from the Baltimore Catechism supplemented by Morning Offering, Pledge to the Cross, the Angelus, the Magnificat, the Regina Coeli, the Memorare, etc. and in the Fall , prayers for Notre Dame. Perhaps the signature happening was the prep for 1st Communion and 1st Confession. Again, very regimented. Practicing Communion was a snap, 1st Confession was not. We practiced with the nuns, and had to make sure we “confessed” imaginary sins, venial type, of course. I now wonder at how our pastor, Father Sheen, was able to keep focus when the entire school went to Confession on Thursdays before each First Friday. One really positive memory regarding those mornings is getting back to school after Mass, and our parents would have homemade rolls and hot chocolate for us. We could smell the goodies even before we filed into the school.

I disliked St. Malachy so much that my academic progress was limited, so my parents reluctantly allowed Sis and I to head back to our rural schools, where we reunited with our neighbors and friends. So, 3rd and 4th in the country. However, when my sister finished 6th grade, and had to go to town, which meant St. Malachy for her, I was sent as well. The regimen had not changed, but some of my buddies from country school and weekly “Catechism” classes had also joined, so I was more accepting of the environment. For the next four years, the majority of our class did not change, and we formed associations that endure even today. We

were confirmed in 7th grade, and in 8th grade we were allowed to attend Shop Class or Home Economics classes at the public Junior High.

When I look at my 8th grade graduation photo, I can still name everyone. I can recall the names of the Nuns, some while smiling, some not. With a selective view from now 67 years after graduation, I believe that, perhaps unknowingly at the time, we formed the foundations that sustain us yet today regarding the closeness of our classmates. When I have seen or heard of them at any time during that decades long interim, my thoughts quickly return to our days at St. Malachy. There have now been four generations of McAvoy's who have attended St. Malachy School, and I imagine that each of those have formed their own memories, mostly with smiles I hope. My best wishes to all who have been, or are currently involved at that special place.

School Memory by Patti Kanke Doe

St Malachy was always a "safe place" for me as a kid attending school there, but as an adult, I realize just how formative it has been for me in my adult years. The friendships I made with my classmates became a lasting bond 20+ years later. I'll see old classmates today and we sink right back into a familiar hug. I'm not sure you could find that kind of lasting relationship anywhere else and I wholeheartedly give credit to St Malachy and its staff for their leadership and life lessons on not only being a devoted Catholic but a decent human being. I'll always thank God for St Malachy School.
