A Note From the Pastor



Dear St. Malachy Parishioners,

He is Risen. Alleluia!

"After this He appeared in another form to two of them walking along on their way to the country. They returned and told the others; but they did not believe them either" (Mark 16:12-13). As I mentioned at the kick-off event for the Gospel of Mark of Challenge, the only other gospel featuring the story of the appearance of the Risen Christ to the disciples on the road to Emmaus (from which our theme verses for this Year of Missionary Discipleship have come) besides Luke is Mark. These two verses contain the entire account. While it lacks the detail of Luke's account, Mark gives us this unique detail that their story was not believed by the other disciples. In his account of the Resurrection, Mark focuses more heavily on the lack of faith of the disciples. Yet, this gives emphasis to the power of their own eventual encounter with the Risen Christ to overcome their disbelief and even their fear, sending them out to *"Go into the whole world and proclaim the gospel to every creature..."* (Mark 16:15).

This is the second Easter of our national Eucharistic Revival. Last year, we focused simply on the real presence of Christ, in the Year of Presence, as we called it at Saint Malachy. Beginning with this focus enabled us to recognize the "breaking of the bread" (the Eucharist) as a true encounter with the Risen Christ. We really meet Him at the altar. Now, in this Year of Missionary Discipleship, we have been focusing on discovering this same breaking of the bread as, not only a place where we meet Jesus, but a place of encounter which sends us out to shine His Light and help make Him more widely known. For this reason, the Easter story from the Road to Emmaus has been a constant reference point for us. In this Easter Season, we will embrace Mark's account of the story (Mark 16:12-13) as our final theme verses. This is especially fitting, since the

Gospel of Mark Challenge was a special part of our Lenten experience, which prepared us for Easter. In this simpler account, Mark is offering us the courage to share the good news of the Resurrection of Our Lord Jesus Christ with others, regardless of how they will respond. We can never control or even perfectly predict how others will respond. We can only control our own choices. With the help of God's grace, we can overcome all of our fears and even our own weakness of faith and share His good news with a world that needs to hear it!



First, let us embrace our own encounter with the Risen Christ. Let us thank the Lord for dying for our sins and for rising again so that we may have new life. And let us thank Him for coming to meet us in the Holy Eucharist. When we make the choice to respond to this gift with humility, gratitude and faith, this Encounter can be the first step of the three step process of missionary discipleship: Encounter, Grow, Go. Our first step is simple and clear. Let us embrace and celebrate our own Encounter with the Risen Christ, ready to grow in His grace and truth, in faith, hope and love, and ready to go share Him with the world. **Happy Easter!**

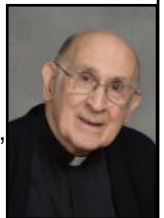
