

A Letter from Father Simon



A layperson working for God. About 785 B.C. Jeroboam II was the king of Israel. The kingdom was highly prosperous, powerful and very rich. But there was a degeneration of morals. Amos, who was neither prophet, nor a prophet's son, but a happy shepherd,

announced the future doom in the land of Israel: the death by sword of the king, and of the chief priest, and the deportation of the people. (Amos 7:12-15). About 200 years after Amos, the lay leaders of the land of Judah refused to care for the flock entrusted to them. Jeremiah, the son of a priest in Judah, announced the dismissal of bad leaders. (Jeremiah 23:1-6). God's plan before the foundation of the world was to allow fellow humans to partake in His plan to establish peace and to reconcile the whole creation with God (Ephesians 1:3-14; 2:13-18). Jesus called laymen to partake in His ministry. Just as Amos was a layman before being called to be a prophet, so also Jesus chose His disciples from among laymen, not religious leaders of His time. After instructing them and sending them out two by two. He also sent out many lay disciples. The mission was fruitful, and the disciples returned rejoicing (Mark 6:7-30; Luke 10:1-24).

Laypeople working in the church. God elects prophets in His own way. The Spirit blows where it chooses (John 3:8). Do we need to be professional prophets or priests before promoting peace, justice and charity in our society today? Following the example of Christ, the Church sets the Obligations and Rights of the Lay Christian Faithful in the canon law, Canons 225 – 231. In summary they are:

•Can. 226 Parents have the most serious obligation Fr. Simon, SMA and the right to educate their children.

•Can. 227 The lay members have the right to freedoms in secular affairs like their fellow citizens.

•Can. 228 Suitable qualified laypersons are capable of being admitted by the sacred Pastors to ecclesiastical offices and functions, and they are capable of being experts and advisors, even in councils according to the norm of law.

•Can. 229 Laypeople have the duty and the right to acquire the knowledge of teachings, doctrines, and sacred sciences. They have the right to be taught in ecclesiastical facilities, and to teach if they are found suitable to teach.

•Canon 230 Laymen, who meet the requirements of the Episcopal Conference, can be admitted to the ministries of lector and acolyte. Laypeople can fulfill the function of lector, commentator, or cantor. Where ministers are not available, laypeople can supply certain functions: to preside over liturgical prayers, to confer baptism, and to distribute Holy Communion.

Laypeople working with SMA Fathers. I am a priest, a member of the SMA Fathers (Society of African Missions). The SMA Fathers are very faithful to the implementation of the canons and decrees of the Episcopal Conferences of their various mission territories. We welcome the desire of different lay groups and persons, including associates, benefactors and collaborators to participate in our mission and life. Many laypeople participate in the mission of the church through the SMA Fathers as lay associates/missionaries, and they use their talents for pastoral work in our missions in Africa among the most abandoned, and for administrative offices. 
