

A Note From the Pastor



Dear St. Malachy Parishioners,

"Remain in me, as I remain in you. Just as a branch cannot bear fruit on its own unless it remains on the vine, so neither can you unless you remain in me" (John 15:4). As I ponder these words of Our Lord from the Last Supper, when He gave us the gift of the Eucharist

(which words also give us our theme verse for this Year of Eucharistic Spirituality), my mind is swimming. Having just returned from the 10th National Eucharistic Congress (NEC), the importance of all of the words that He shared with His Apostles at the Last Supper weighs rather heavily upon me, yet not as a heavy burden, but as a fire burning within the chest, wanting to consume me and all around me. I also have had other impactful experiences from the summer, about which I have not yet shared. Still, now that it is my first day back to the office, after the week of vacation that preceded my visit to the NEC, many tasks and responsibilities are beginning to weigh upon me as well. Anyone who has ever tried to step away from their job for a time and then had to return can relate to this experience. In this, the Lord is at work, inviting us to pour ourselves out for others with Him and so discover a different kind of intimacy with Him. Yet, the Enemy is also at work, wanting to use the weight of all that has piled up while we were away to smother the flame that the Lord has kindled. And so, we come back to the importance of those words: "Remain in Me, as I remain in you." It can be so tempting to set the Lord to the side for a time so that we can "get our work done." But, then we remember what He taught us: "Without me, you can do nothing" but "whoever remains in Me and I in Him will bear much fruit." We need the Lord. May we never fall into the trap of thinking that we can do life without Him. And so, perhaps another time I can share more about all the Lord has shared with me and taught me this summer. For now, I would simply like to recommend to you a prayer that is a frequent go-to for me, including on my trip: "Stay with me, Lord, and help me to stay with You. Amen."

A Letter from Father Simon



Sharing one's paucity with God: After harvest, a man brought the best fruits from his farm to Elisha, twenty barley loaves and fresh grains. Also, a small boy offered his five barley loaves and two fish to Jesus as his participation in the feeding of five thousand men. At the order of Elisha and Jesus, the

hungry people ate from the little loaves and there were some leftovers gathered in baskets. (2 Kings 2:42-44; John 6:1-15). Moses built the sanctuary of God by using the people's offering for the project (Exodus 36:5). The church is made of people of different social backgrounds. We ought to support one another by keeping the one body of Christ alive, by giving hope to the downcast, and by nurturing the bond of peace. (Ephesians 4:1-6) When we offer something to the church, it is the body of Christ that we build, and so, we participate in the mission of Christ. God knows how to make abundance from the little we offer. God loves and favors cheerful givers. (2 Corinthians 9:7-8) The need of the church and of neighbors offers us opportunities to be generous. The food of one person is big enough to be shared by two. No amount is too little for God.

What happens to what you give to SMA fathers?

The SMA fathers, (Society of African Missions) has always witnessed the working of the divine providence in the church. Many of you had given something for the work of the SMA fathers in difficult missions, among the most abandoned. Some of you are still planning to do more. SMA members in difficult missions and in seminaries appeal to the SMA province in the USA for help. What you give to the SMA province in the USA is used to supply for the needs of SMA missions, the needs of priests and laypeople in difficult missions, and the needs of SMA seminarians in Africa, For example, my parents paid nothing for my seminary training for priesthood. The SMA paid for my training, travels, and everything else, by using what each person contributed to the SMA Fathers. The SMA fathers are always grateful for your generosity, and we welcome whatever you give, small and big amounts alike.

I am grateful. For the past thirty days, I experienced your generosity at St. Malachy's parish, Geneseo. Some welcomed me to their dining tables. And many others wished to invite me, but I only had thirty days in my schedule. Cont...

Thanks to you, Fr. Daniel Gifford. I appreciate you all. Above all, I love your lively parish community. Remember Jesus' assurance: "Whoever gives only a cup of cold water to one of these little ones to drink because he is a disciple-- amen. I say to you, he will surely not lose his reward." (Matthew 10:42) I think of you as I raise the cup of salvation and celebrate the Eucharist. God bless you.


