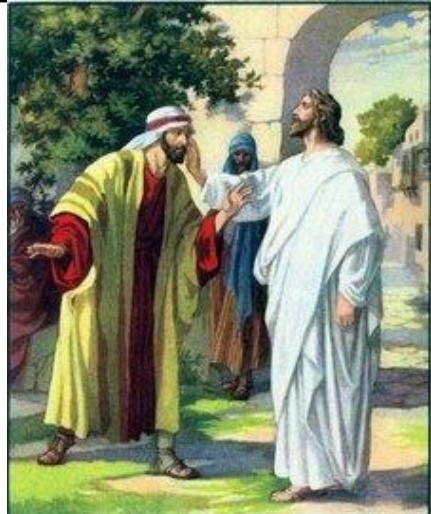

A Letter from the Pastor



Dear St. Malachy Parishioners,

"Nothing that enters one from outside can defile that person; but the things that come from within are what defile." (Mark 7). As we return to the Gospel of Mark, after five weeks in the Gospel of John, we find these words of Our Lord, given in response to the scribes and

Pharisees objecting that the disciples of Jesus ate their meals with unwashed hands. It is worth noting that this takes place right after the first multiplication of loaves. Only John tells the story we have been reading for the past few weeks of how Jesus used this miracle as an occasion for His Bread of Life discourse. By contrast, Mark tells the story of *both* multiplications of loaves and these events become hinge points for an entire section of the gospel, in which bread comes up quite frequently. For example, here we see conflict over how they take their meals (sometimes translated as "eat bread"). Albeit in a very different way, Mark is subtly inviting us to notice the significance of these miracles in which the Messiah gives us bread to eat, which foreshadows the climax of His mission, when He will take bread in His hands and tell us, "This is My Body," which will be given up for you.

What a tremendous gift He gave us, in that banquet that makes present His perfect act of love on the cross, where His Body is given up and His Blood is poured out. May we unite our hearts to this perfect act of love and so learn to love God and to love one another. May we be united in love with the Lord and with one another in Him. *"Remain in me, as I remain in you. Just as a branch cannot bear fruit on its own unless it remains on the vine, so neither can you unless you remain in me"* (John 15:4).

PARISH MISSION SPEAKER: Last week, I wrote about our Parish Mission on **November 3-5** and introduced you to our musician (John Paul Von Arx). This week, I am happy to introduce you to our speaker, **Oscar Rivera**. As I



shared after Masses, in beginning to view some of the talks he has delivered at previous Steubenville Youth Conferences, I have been deeply impressed and begun to get excited about the chance to bring him here to Saint Malachy. Let me share what is found in

the biography on his website (oscartwoten.com): "Oscar Rivera was raised in the inner city of Waterbury, Connecticut, and was taught at an early age how to be a survivor... Oscar's energy and passion for the faith makes his approach: inspirational and real-to-life... He brings a message of hope in times of despair, love during times of hate, and faithfully follow God, no matter the obstacles. His life has been devoted to the New Evangelization of the Gospel and his upbeat contemporary approach to the good news has made the message easy to understand, follow, and relate to. Christianity is not boring, and Oscar does not intend to be either." Let us pray for Oscar and John Paul, that the Lord will bless them and work through them, as well as praying for our own hearts to be open to all that we will receive through them. Finally, let's mark our calendars for the mission and think about who the Lord is calling us to invite!

RETIREMENT OF DCN. ROBERT: It is rather bittersweet to share with you that Deacon Robert O'Rourke will be retiring from his position on our parish staff. He will remain active as a deacon, but will finally begin enjoying retirement from his work here on staff. Over the past (almost) four years that I have been here at Saint Malachy, it has been a great privilege, a joy and a comfort to have Robert as my "right hand man." He works very hard for this parish and has helped address many needs. I feel confident in saying that the average parishioner has no idea how much this man has done for us. For this reason, it is with great gratitude that I congratulate him on his retirement. His plan is to continue in his position through the end of the Liturgical Year (end of November). Now that this news is public, this gives me time to consult with members of Parish Staff, Finance Council and Building and Grounds Committee to discern how best to meet the needs left in his absence. Once it has been determined precisely what kind of position we should be seeking, we will begin another hiring process to seek that person. Please pray for the guidance of the Holy Spirit in this process.

In Memory of Father Pakula, St. Malachy Parish will have a monthly theme to collect items for the Geneseo-Atkinson Food Pantry.

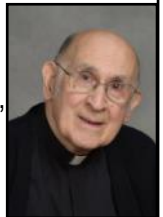
