





A Letter from the Pastor

Dear St. Malachy Parishioners,



mind all of the great starts we have had over the past few weeks to Saint Malachy School, CCD, Confirmation Prep and Youth Ministry. The work of receiving His children and bringing them to Him is of the greatest importance. I am grateful to all of our staff and volunteers who help make this happen, especially under the leadership of our new team. You may notice in this bulletin that the updated times have been posted for The Rock and Oasis, beginning after the upcoming Fall Fest. With both of these programs now offered on Wednesdays, the image has come to me of a "relay team" for youth religious education, at least on that day. Devon Schaaf "carries the baton" during the school day, before she passes it to Michelle Ganson, who then passes it on to Sara Osborn to finish out the evening. Of course, they don't carry the baton alone, but are assisted by their own teams, consisting of school teachers, CCD teachers, youth ministry volunteers, aides, administrative assistant (Shannon Carroll), secretary (Katrina Jensen) and other staff. It is quite the team!

Still, this is just the beginning. Throughout the Gospel, Jesus can be heard referring to all of His disciples as "children" and "little ones." For this reason, I think also of those adults who are currently engaged in a different kind of school, namely *Psalms: The School of Prayer*, our current adult Bible study. The Lord calls us, all of us, to follow Him like children, ready to learn and grow with humble hearts. May we be united in love with the Lord and with one another in Him. "Remain in me, as I remain in you. Just as a branch cannot bear fruit on its own unless it remains on the vine, so neither can you unless you remain in me" (John 15:4).

NEW INFORMATION STATION: Some of you may have noticed that we have begun to implement a new mode of making information more readily available to parishioners. On the information table in the narthex, we have a rack of folders containing information about our various committees. In each folder, you should find a basic description of the purpose of that group, when they meet, a roster and the most recent approved minutes. We hope this increases overall parishioner awareness of the activities of our various committees, including ways that you might be able to be more actively involved.

IRELAND PILGRIMAGE: Ever since I first studied the apparition of Our Lady in Knock (Ireland) in seminary. I have felt drawn to go there. In recent years. this desire to make a pilgrimage to Knock and other parts of Ireland has grown even stronger and more focused. But, various circumstances have delayed that prospect until now. I am pleased to share with you that I will be co-leading a pilgrimage to Ireland and Northern Ireland with a priest friend of mine from seminary, on July 21-29, 2025. A pilgrimage is more than a vacation. The best explanation I've heard of a pilgrimage is that "it's not quite a retreat and not quite a vacation, but somehow it's a bit of both." It is a spiritual journey, both journeying with the Lord and also setting out to find Him in a new way. If you are interested in being a part of this spiritual journey, I invite you to see this bulletin for further detail. While this is not a parish event, I certainly wanted to extend a special invitation to any of our parishioners who may be interested, especially since the itinerary was planned with consideration of experiencing, not only beautiful places relevant to Our Lady of Knock, Saint Patrick and various Irish saints, but also to our own patron, Saint Malachy. I'd love to have you join us.


