

# A Letter from the Pastor



Dear St. Malachy Parishioners,

"Remain in me, as I remain in you. Just as a branch cannot bear fruit on its own unless it remains on the vine, so neither can you unless you remain in me" ( John 15:4). These words have been our theme verse for this Year of Eucharistic Spirituality. This final year of our

Eucharistic Revival has led us to pray that we may be united in love with the Lord and with one another in Him. This might be described as a very basic fruit of the Holy Eucharist, which serves as a foundation for understanding and living a Eucharistic Spirituality. In order to live this Eucharistic Spirituality of being united in love, the goal of this year is to get in touch with our deepest desire: the hunger and thirst for Christ that is fulfilled in that Holy Communion that so unites us to Him that we are broken and poured out with Him and in Him, as we are sent out on mission.

Both the mystery of our thirst for Christ and the mystery of being poured out with Him, as we are united in love with His sacrificial act of love, will be illustrated in our upcoming stained glass windows, which will focus on the imagery of Psalm 42: "As the deer longs for the running waters, so my soul longs for You, O God. "It has been awhile since I have written about this addition to our worship space, which will be coming in 2025. But, the message illustrated within these windows resonates beautifully with this Year of Eucharistic Spirituality. The thirst in our hearts for the Lord is a reflection of His own thirst for us, for our love, which is far



deeper and greater than ours. The stream that satisfies our thirst is the Divine Mercy pouring from His Heart, which is truly tasted in the Holy Eucharist (which is why the design of the windows, which you can view in the narthex, features a stream which has the altar as its source). Profoundly, this saving stream so unites us in love with the Lord that we too are poured out with Him, to satisfy thirsty souls still seeking Him.

I know that not everyone was in favor of these windows or their design and so some do not always appreciate when I teach about their meaning. Yet, as I have listened to people's experiences and thoughts, I have also heard people asking me why this imagery was chosen, as it seems to some that they merely depict an obscure psalm chosen out of one person's personal preference. Rather, the selection of this imagery was prayerfully discerned and was not the vision of any one person. I truly believe that the Holy Spirit led us to this design because our parish is being invited to reflect upon these mysteries for years to come, both to rediscover the thirst in our hearts, which is so often suffocated by distractions, and also to consider how the Eucharist unites us to His sacrificial love, so that we are poured out into our local community to satisfy thirsty souls still seeking Him. Therefore, please know that when I offer reflections about Psalm 42 and the imagery in the windows, I am both attempting to answer the question of why this design was chosen and also help us all to deeper reflection of all that the Lord might be saying to us. "Genuine sacred art draws man into adoration, to prayer, and to the love of God, Creator and Savior, the Holy One and Sanctifier" (Catechism of the Catholic Church 2502).

Last month, a small group of committee members and other interested parties had a chance to travel to Daprato Rigali Studios in Chicago. It was a fascinating experience to observe and learn about the process of making the windows. In a few weeks, we will return to the topic and have more information to share.

SURVEYS AND CONVERSATIONS: Finally, I want to take the opportunity to address the many conversations that have taken place as a result of this window project and the feedback received through the surveys, as well as private interactions. Again, I am sorry that the process was not as communicative or collaborative as it could have been and that some parishioners have felt excluded or uninformed. While none of that was intentional, I am grateful for how the Lord has worked through this whole situation, allowing me and other parish leadership to hear feedback that has already and will

continue to bear good fruit in the ongoing improvement of listening to feedback from a variety of perspectives, added the new information station (folders) at the information table in the narthex, improved the flow of parish council and the context of a committee, a survey or a private various other meetings, and began offering a monthly communication. May all of these efforts help us to grow ever summary of the parish council meeting in the bulletin. 
