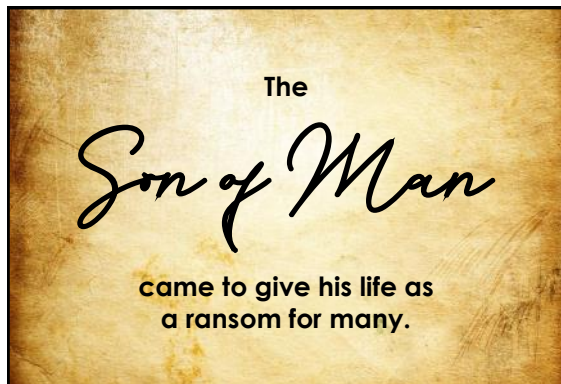

The Flooring Subcommittee has begun meeting and has begun the Discernment Phase. This phase consists of evaluating parishioner input and guidance from the Finance Council, Building and Grounds Committee, and Liturgy Committee to determine whether or not to move forward with the *sanctuary flooring project at this time, or simply focus on repairing what is damaged. This decision should be reached by the end of November.*

A Letter from the Pastor



“Remain in me, as I remain in you. Just as a branch cannot bear fruit on its own unless it remains on the vine, so neither can you unless you remain in me” (John 15:4). As we pray that we may be united in love with the Lord and with one another in Him, let us pray that all Christians, and all men and women of goodwill, would be united in the support of life from conception to natural death. I mentioned this last week, as we began Respect Life Month. That first letter focused on the urgent matter of the defense of life in the womb, the violence of abortion and the healing power of God’s mercy. But, the focus of our support of life is not only from conception, but also to natural death. Therefore, abortion is not the only matter relevant to Respect Life Month. However, rather than highlighting each of the various crimes against the dignity of life, I want to take a different approach this year. The life and dignity of the human person is the first of a series of seven principles, which the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops has proposed for Catholic Social Teaching. Additionally, this month is also Month of the Rosary, in which we look to Our Lady. Years ago, I wrote a set of reflections on what we learn from Mary about these principles, which I will share in the coming weeks:

The Life and Dignity of the Human Person: “Hail, holy Queen, ... to thee do we cry, poor banished children of Eve.” The mercies extended to humanity through Mary are intended for all the children of Eve. All have been banished and cast out of the garden by the inheritance of original sin. But, “every person is precious,” in the words of the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops, in their document *Sharing Catholic Social Teaching*, and for this reason, God wills salvation for each person. In her Magnificat, Mary tells us that “He has filled the hungry with good things, and the rich he has sent away empty (Lk 1: 46-55).” Upon first glance, this quote may seem like goodness is not willed for the rich. But, this leaves the question, “how can one receive good things when his hands are full?”... In Jesus’ encounter with a rich young man, who asked “what do I still lack” in order to gain eternal life, He tells him to sell what he has and give to the poor, sending the rich away empty (Mt. 19:16-22). Often focus is placed on the fact that the rich young man “went away sad, for he had many possessions,” and perhaps it can be overlooked that Jesus told him to sell what he had as a

command for how he could gain eternal life. Jesus willed that even the rich young man should gain eternal life, and this is why he was sent away empty... But, this emptiness was for the sake of salvation, not damnation. The basis of the dignity of every human person is found in the fact that all are willed for salvation.

Call to Family, Community, and Participation: “The family is the central social institution that must be supported and strengthened, not undermined (USCCB).” At a wedding feast, Mary exults this celebration of the beginning of a new family as an occasion of great importance. It is here that she first presents the needs of man: “They have no wine (Jn 2:1-12).” Further, she directs the people to go to Him in their need: “Do whatever He tells you.” In this way, she urges Jesus to perform his first miracle and begin His ministry. In a sense, she ushers in the marriage of the Christ, the Bridegroom and His bride, the Church, at this place of great importance, the foundation of a family. Her appreciation for the family, and even of the broader community, also becomes apparent in the instance of the first recorded separation of the Holy Family (Lk 2: 41-52). When Jesus is left behind in Jerusalem, so great is the longing in her heart to be reunited with her son and to see the family no longer divided that she and Joseph proceeded for three days to look for him “with great anxiety.” Further, Luke notes that they “looked for him among their relatives and acquaintances.” In need, they turned to the community. The text does not record that they became suspicious and accusative of those in the caravan. Rather than divisiveness or extreme individualism, this caravan traveling back from Jerusalem must have held a strong sense of community to yield such trust from Mary and Joseph.

Rights and Responsibilities: “He has filled the hungry with good things” are the words that Mary tells her cousin Elizabeth (Lk 2:41-52). In this way, she is communicating to her cousin her “right to those things required for human decency (USCCB),” and in this communication she demonstrates faithfulness to her own responsibility upon being filled with good things. Upon bringing the annunciation that she would conceive of the Holy Spirit, the angel Gabriel also brought news that Elizabeth had become pregnant in her old age (Lk 1:36-38). It is interesting that Gabriel does not explicitly command Mary to go and attend to the needs of Elizabeth. One may imagine him adding, “you know what to do.” But, he does not need to, for Mary knows her (continued)


responsibility and answers "May it be done to me according to your word." Then, she "set out... in haste" to attend to Elizabeth and be faithful to her responsibilities (Lk 1:39).

More to come next week, as we have four more principles left to consider...

In Memory of Father Pakula, St. Malachy Parish will have a monthly theme to collect items for the Geneseo-Atkinson Food Pantry.

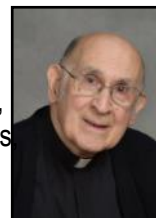
