Brice Maertens and Heidi Vorac provided updates on adult faith formation. The council agreed to sponsor a dialogue between various councils/committees in February to conclude discussion on Subcommittee on Stained Glass Windows report, as well as frequency of future parish missions. Also, the council voted on the annual Parish Christmas book!

A Letter from the Pastor



Dear St. Malachy Parishioners,

“Stand erect and raise your heads because your redemption is at hand” (Luke 21). With these words, Our Lord invites us into the Advent spirit of awaiting His Second Coming. Of course, we are aided in this waiting by the process of also awaiting and preparing for the celebration of His First Coming at Christmas. No one can help us enter into this Advent spirit of awaiting Christ quite like Our Lady. Therefore, this Advent, I am going to feature a different Marian apparition. This week, we will begin with one that has particular resonance with the apocalyptic tone of this weekend’s readings: Our Lady of Knock (County Mayo, Ireland, featured in March of our 2025 parish calendar):

It was on the rainy evening of August 21, 1879, when the silvery-white light began to appear on the outside wall of the Church of Saint John the Baptist, which had been the home parish to the faithful of Knock. The light attracted many people to come and see what manner of spectacle had come to their little village. The rain did not stop Mary McLoughlin, housekeeper to the parish priest of Knock and first visionary of Knock, from hurrying to the house of her neighbor, bringing news of what she had seen. The crowd grew until over a dozen people, ranging in age from 5 to 65 years old, had been drawn to this mysterious light. The rain continued to fall, yet the area within the light appeared to remain dry. The night grew dark, but the light on the wall of the church did not fade, and neither did the image within so much as flicker. It was within that light that the Blessed Virgin appeared, along with her holy companions.

The Mother of God was dressed in a white cloak, with a large crown resting upon her head. She stood tall, roughly two feet above the ground, with her eyes directed toward Heaven. She was noted to be life-size, but she spoke no words at all. Yet, the Woman, clothed in white and bathed in light, was not alone. She was accompanied by two men, each of whom had responded faithfully to the divine prompting, from an angel and from Christ Himself, to take her into his home. On the right side of the Virgin stood St. Joseph, who also wore white robes and appeared to be bowing respectfully toward the Virgin. St. John the Evangelist, the beloved disciple to whom Mary was entrusted at the cross, stood to the left of the

Virgin. The Evangelist wore a miter, held a large open book and appeared to be preaching, as he stood turned slightly away from the other two. The final figure was of great importance. To the left of St. John stood a lamb upon an altar, which also bore a cross, surrounded by angel wings. This image matches the identification of Jesus Christ, by Saint John the Baptist, the patron of the parish, as the Lamb of God, as well as the vision seen by John the Evangelist in Revelation. The image is rich in symbolism and significance.

Today, the event of this apparition is commemorated by statues of the images, after the model of the apparition, decorating the shrine that sits in the site where they appeared. As pilgrims continued to visit the shrine in the coming decades, John Paul II noted that, “the sick and suffering, people handicapped in body or mind, troubled in their faith or their conscience... have been healed, comforted and confirmed in their faith because they trusted that the Mother of God would lead them to her Son, Jesus.” May Our Lady of Knock intercede for us, that our hearts may receive the promise made by Our Lord at the Last Supper (our theme verse for this Advent): “Peace I leave with you; my peace I give to you. Not as the world gives do I give it to you. Do not let your hearts be troubled or afraid” (John 14:27).

WANT TO GO TO KNOCK?: If reading this brief account of the story of Our Lady of Knock inspires in you a desire to go and visit the site of this beautiful apparition, please see the information in this bulletin about a pilgrimage to Ireland and Northern Ireland this July. I hope you can join us!

ADVENT CONFESSIONS: We will resume our custom from past years of making special Advent Reconciliation times available every Monday - Thursday at 12:00 PM until 12:30. The sacrament will also be offered at ADORE this month: Wednesday, December 4 at 7:00 PM (please note the time change from past months). I hope you can receive this beautiful sacrament some time this Advent, as it is a beautiful way to prepare our hearts for Jesus Christ.

In Memory of Father Pakula, St. Malachy Parish will have a monthly theme to collect items for the Geneseo-Atkinson Food Pantry.

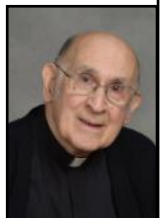
