



# Did you Know?

Your child can attend a Catholic School Financial Assistance Available

Tuition assistance scholarship grants from the endowment fund established as a result of the Diocese of Peoria ROOTED IN FAITH Campaign and named in honor of Archbishop Spalding, the first Bishop of Peoria, will be available for the 2025-2026 school year for students enrolled in or intending to enroll in grades Kindergarten through 12 in any Catholic school located in the Diocese of Peoria whose families are active members of a Catholic parish in the diocese. All grants will be based on financial need objectively assessed.

Information about the grants and application materials may be obtained from any Catholic elementary or secondary school in the Diocese of Peoria or on the Diocesan website www.cdop.org under **Catholic Schools** and then under **John Lancaster Spalding** Scholarship. Consult the detailed protocols and procedures and checklist at the bottom of the webpage for all requirements necessary to be eligible for an award.

Parents must apply online at: **online.factsmgt.com/aid**. Families of students currently receiving grants are reminded that all grants are for one year only, and anyone seeking to renew a grant for the 2025-2026 school year must reapply.

**Deadline date** for the completed application is **April 25, 2025.** Notification of grant awards will be made in June of 2025.

# A Letter from the Pastor



Dear St. Malachy Parishioners,

"Raising His eyes toward His disciples,"
(Luke 6:20a) Jesus spoke to their hearts. Have you ever considered the Lord's eyes upon you as you read the Scriptures? In our Lectionary this weekend, we begin reading another great

sermon of the Lord, which we will continue until we begin Lent.

But, before we dive into the content of the sermon itself, it is worth noting this simple phrase, reminding us that Jesus has His eyes locked on us as He speaks. He doesn't simply "talk at us," He speaks to us, straight into our hearts. How easily



we can forget that His eyes are fixed on us, as He speaks to us at Mass, during the Liturgy of the Word! How easily we can forget this whenever we read the Scriptures! As promised, I am giving information this weekend about our upcoming Gospel of Luke Challenge. Before I dive into those details, this is the first suggestion I would offer for your reading of the Scriptures. Before you begin reading, stop and consider His eyes upon you. Rest in His gaze of love, even for a moment and remember that He never takes His eyes off of you.

## GOSPEL OF LUKE CHALLENGE: We will begin March 1.

- READING GOAL: The goal is to read one chapter each day, in order to finish on March 24, just before the Feast of the Annunciation. Not sure you can do it? Afraid you might get behind? I encourage you to try. No matter what, the time spent diving into the Good News will be worth it! Thinking you might read smaller sections than a whole chapter each day and finish on a later date? That still counts. As long as you promise to do your best to read the Gospel of Luke every day from March 1 to March 24, you're in! And we want as many people in as possible. Our parish is guaranteed to grow stronger the more of us are making time to listen to the Lord.
- PARTICIPATION GOAL: The past two years we have had just over 200 people participating in our Gospel challenges. Therefore, this year, our base goal is simply 200 people. Let us know you are participating by

- responding to the email that will be sent out or calling the parish office.
- INCENTIVE: If we reach 200 participants again, participants will be able to vote on the immediate fate of my facial hair. Will it be a moustache? Chops? A fu manchu? A soul patch? Oh the possibilities! As an additional incentive for our teenagers, they will narrow the options, from which the rest of the participating parishioners will vote. The final solution will be dealt out at a Coffee and Donuts on March 30 after the 10:30 Mass.
- GROWTH: As I mentioned last week, the hope is to get as many people as possible working on achieving our goal, so that we can have more people reading the Scriptures together. Thus, we want to far exceed our base goal. Thus, for every 10 people beyond the goal, I will have one additional day to wait before I can change my new facial hair. It would be a shame if I only had to keep it for one day.
- BONUS ELEMENTS: We will hold an **Invocation Night** (previously titled "Kick-Off Event"), as a night of prayer and reflection at the beginning of the challenge on Tuesday, March 4 at 6:30 PM, followed by a special Tuesday night Adore. We also will again be able to offer **Daily Emails** and weekly episodes of **Three Friends and a Bible**. I hope these elements encourage you and help you to experience this as an effort that unites you with other parishioners.
- REAL GOAL: The real goal is not about numbers or facial hair, but about more people encountering Jesus Christ in the gospel. For this reason, more guidance about how to pray with the gospel will be coming next week.

COLLEGE VISITS IN PROGRESS: Earlier this week, I had my first college visit and was able to enjoy lunch and a game of pool with a couple of our young parishioners at Western Illinois University (see picture). I look forward to next month, when I plan to visit lowa State University and Benedictine College. If you know of other parishioners at these campuses with whom you can connect me, please let me know.


#### **February is Heart Month**

Registration now open for Stay with Me: Lenten Prayer for Disciples All are welcome for this virtual prayer for the six Wednesdays of Lent

Springfield, III.—Women and men everywhere are invited to join the Dominican Sisters of Springfield for *Stay with Me: Lenten Prayer for Disciples*. The virtual sessions, scheduled for 7:00 pm Central Time on the Wednesdays of Lent starting March 5, will allow space for participants to attune their hearts and minds to the struggles of those Jesus most often accompanied during his life on Earth: widows, orphans, and persons cast out. The title draws on Jesus' request in Matthew's gospel that the disciples accompany him to Gethsemane while he prays, just before his arrest.

Hosted by the Dominican Sisters' Vocation Office, participants can expect to

- •hear reflections on the theme from Dominican sisters.
- •enjoy periods of silence and sharing, and build a community of prayer and mutual support for their Lenten practice.

"We welcome women who are discerning a call to religious life, of course," said Springfield Dominican Sister Denise Glazik, the congregation's vocation director. "And we hope that all women and men, wherever they are and whatever their circumstance, will find this a meaningful way station on their Lenten journey."

The liturgical season of Lent includes six weeks before Holy Week. It is a time of prayer, fasting and almsgiving in preparation for the celebration of the passion, death, and resurrection of Jesus. The baptized are encouraged to use this time to prepare for the renewal of their baptismal promises. Parish communities may also be accompanying those who intend to join the Church. For them, Lent is considered a six-week retreat in preparation for their baptism or profession of faith. Customarily, then, these new Catholics are welcomed into the church during the services on Holy Saturday, during the Triduum.

Stay with Me: Lenten Prayer for Disciples runs weekly March 5-April 9. Participants are welcome to join all six sessions, or choose a few according to their own schedule and needs. Register once for participation in any or all of the sessions at <a href="mailto:springfieldop.org/events">springfieldop.org/events</a>.

The Dominican Sisters of Springfield were founded in 1873 and have served God and God's people in the United States, and in Peru, since 1965.
